**Hornby Trucker Critical Undergoes Bone Graft**

Willard Shier, the 22-year-old Hornby truck driver who survived a violent two-truck head-on collision underwent surgery in the Hamilton General Hospital.

A relative of Shier said the injured man had a piece of legbone grafted to his neck, broken in the accident. His wife was allowed to visit him for a few minutes after the operation.

Shier hovered between life and death for two days following the crash that sent both drivers to hospitals. His injuries were the more severe. He sustained a broken back, broken neck and severely damaged spleen.

Driver of the other vehicle, Sylvia Gagan, of Toronto, was admitted to Toronto General Hospital with head injuries and undetermined injuries to his neck and left shoulder. The accident occurred at the intersection of No. 5 Sideroad and the Nassagaweya Town Line about two miles south of Campbellville.

Following the accident, an ambulance operator said the collision was the worst he has seen in 10 years.

Shier, described by friends as a "great guy and a good worker," has shown amazing stamina, doctors report. He has been conscious most of the time since the accident, though sometimes hovered on the brink of coma.

**Fire Burns Barn, Cattle Blame Boys with Matches**

Three boys playing with matches touched off an explosive "bonfire" Thursday afternoon on a farm owned by Jack M. Fraser, president of the Canadian National Exhibition.

A barn and five valuable Holstein steers were consumed in the raging flames within two hours despite efforts of three fire detachments.

The fire loss is estimated at more than \$20,000. The barn alone was worth \$20,000. The Fraser farm is on the Base Line, south of Georgetown.

A pedigree bull and four calves died in the fire. One calf to survive the holocaust is lying in a small shed suffering from smoke injury at the rear of the property but is not expected to live.

First at the scene of the blaze was Janet Frankruyster, his centre of operations are aged 10, who attempted to free the stock from pens and then ran back to alert Fraser's son, Jim.

Mrs. Frankruyster said Jim rushed into the barn and freed two calves while another herd bull released the bull. The bull in its panic rushed head long into the blaze again and was lost.

One of the beasts rescued from the blaze was a pedigree bull calf, son of Foud Hope, which had just been sold for \$1,500 the day before. It was to have been shipped last night, said Fraser.
