**Check Bush Fire  
In Twenty Minutes**

A fire that could have swept through the under dry brush in the vicinity of the dump was checked in twenty minutes by firemen Sunday.

Chief Erwin Lewis said he suspected children playing in the area, but said it's possible a spark from the dump may have caused the fire.

Firemen were alerted about 7:30 Sunday night and had the threat checked at about 10 to 8. They ran the trucks as close as possible to the scene and knocked out the flames with heavy streams of water.

A call Thursday night which took firemen to a brick house on Guelph St near the high school needed little attention. A fire in a clothes dryer was the cause of smoke but practically no damage.

Concern of overcrowding of some Georgetown houses was expressed at Monday's council meeting.

Reeve Elliott said the zoning administrator should take action if more than one family is living in a single family dwelling. The county health unit had been asked to check on one home, but has not yet reported to council.

The definition of "family" in the zoning by-law is somewhat confused, Cr. Young pointed out, and the planning board was asked to advise council whether family should include only parents and children.

A report from the zoning administrator was requested for next week's council meeting.

**Credit Acting  
Strangely Some  
Blame Earthquakes**

Since early Tuesday the Credit River has been acting strangely and no one can give a definite reason for it.

Stan White, Credit Valley Conservation Authority field officer, said the river has been rising and falling a fluctuation of some eighteen inches, over half hour periods.

He said the fluctuation is not noticeable in the Georgetown, Norval, Glen Williams area or up stream however. The rising and falling is most noticeable from Erindale south.

Lake and river fluctuation of from 6 to 9 inches are common due to atmospheric conditions, but the foot and half variance every half hour is very unusual.

There has been some speculation that the earth tremors in Japan are causing the river's irregular behavior.
