Rev. John C. Hill, minister in Oakville and the new Pineview School in Esqueaux, during his stay here, adding and charge that includes churches in Ashgrove, Hornby and Bethel, preached his last sermon there Sunday, July 5. He has accepted a new post at St. John's United Church of Galt, and moved there with his family the previous Friday. Rev. E. He explains the church is about six years old and has been served by retired clergy since it was founded. It is one of four United Churches in the city of Galt.

**Came in 1958**  
Mr. Hill came to Halton in July, 1958, and looks back on six enjoyable years serving the tri-county charge. During the past six years, he has been a member of the Credit Valley, Georgetown and Oakville Ministerial Associations. He loves working with boys and founded the First Ashgrove Boy Scout troop and watched it grow to a membership of 12. He also helped start the Drumpan Scout and Cub groups and served there as Chaplain, as well as a member of the Group Committee.

An avid ham radio operator, he and his Scouts participated in the past two years in the international Scout Jamboree on the Airwaves, establishing radio contacts with many Scout organizations around the world. Last year, his set was made provincial headquarters for the weekend radio jamboree.

**Active with Groups**  
He has also been active with Sigma Chi and Tyro groups, and taught religious education at Pineview school — and formerly at Hornby and Quatre Bras schools. Mr. Hill also shared story-telling sessions at the Sunshine School for Retarded Children at Hornby, with Rev. J. E. Maxwell of St. Stephen's Anglican Church, Hornby.
