

## Machinery Representative Dies Suddenly At Cottage

## Halton Police Force Plan Unable To Find Recruits

OAKVILLE — A proposed 30-man Halton County auxiliary police force under the Emergency Measures Organization has got off a shaky ground and may not get off the ground at all.

The reason is the insufficient number of applications received so far by the various police departments in the county which placed advertisements in the local press over a month ago.

Oakville is to provide ten volunteers, as well as Burlington, Georgetown and Milton to provide five each. However almost nobody seems to be willing to join the unpaid force, and applications are merely trickling in.

The county EMO committee has already taken steps in an effort to raise the number of applicants, needed by this fall when the training courses are to begin.

One step, proposed was that the advertising should be changed to allow a longer period of time for the information to be placed in front of

the public. 500 posters will be printed and distributed in several locations, to advertise for auxiliary volunteers.

Also suggested was that the minimum age for the EMO volunteers be lowered to 18 from the original 21 years required.

Mr. Schleissner also paid the second highest price of \$460 for a five-year-old daughter of Roeland Reflection Sovereign, and bought a heifer calf at \$225, sired by the same bull.

The top price for a bred heifer was \$360 paid by Bertram Stewart, Waterdown, Ont., for Anis Pabst Dividend Ethel, a daughter of Dividend Clipper, and out of the 'Very Good' cow Glenora Roeland Pabst.

Earl Walton and Sons, Dundalk, paid \$450 for a bred heifer from a 'Good Plus' dam and sired by Pabst Roamer Adm, a 'Very Good' and class 'Extra' bull.

C. L. Livingston, Bolton, Ont., paid \$400 for a 'Very Good' nine-year-old cow sired by the 'Very Good' and Superior Type Brownview Pabst Realization and \$410 for a five-year-old 'Good Plus' daughter of Rosale Consul.

Andrew C. McClure, Brampton, paid \$410 for a 'Very Good' nine-year-old daughter of Raymondale H. A. Finest.

Walkerton Dairies bought nine heifers including two milking females at \$350 each. James R. Armstrong, Inglewood, paid \$370 for a six-year-old daughter of the 'Very Good' cow Purple Heights Lavina.

31 head brought a total of \$8,805, for an average of \$288 each. 20 milking females averaged \$334; 1 bull brought \$205; three bred heifers averaged \$308; three open yearlings \$181 and 7 heifer calves \$180 each.

## Purchase Residence For \$18,200 As Children's Aid Foster Home

The Oakville residence which the Executive purchased for \$18,200, will be used as a group foster home, and will be eligible for a \$5,000 Provincial grant, and a \$500 winter works grant.

Reeve H. Hinton of Acton vehemently stated that the Children's Aid was out of order in making the purchase, without the approval of County Council. No other boards or commissions are allowed to take this, he claimed, and felt the C.A.S. had no authority either.

Warden Gordon Gallagher explained the C.A.S. apparently had the authority, and deputy clerk Jim Andrews pointed out that the County can refuse the Children's Aid a grant, but cannot control the manner in which it is spent.

On this note of indecision, county Council felt it would be wise to consult with the Minister of Welfare.
