Hay Fever Sufferers Beware The Ragweed's Almost Ripe

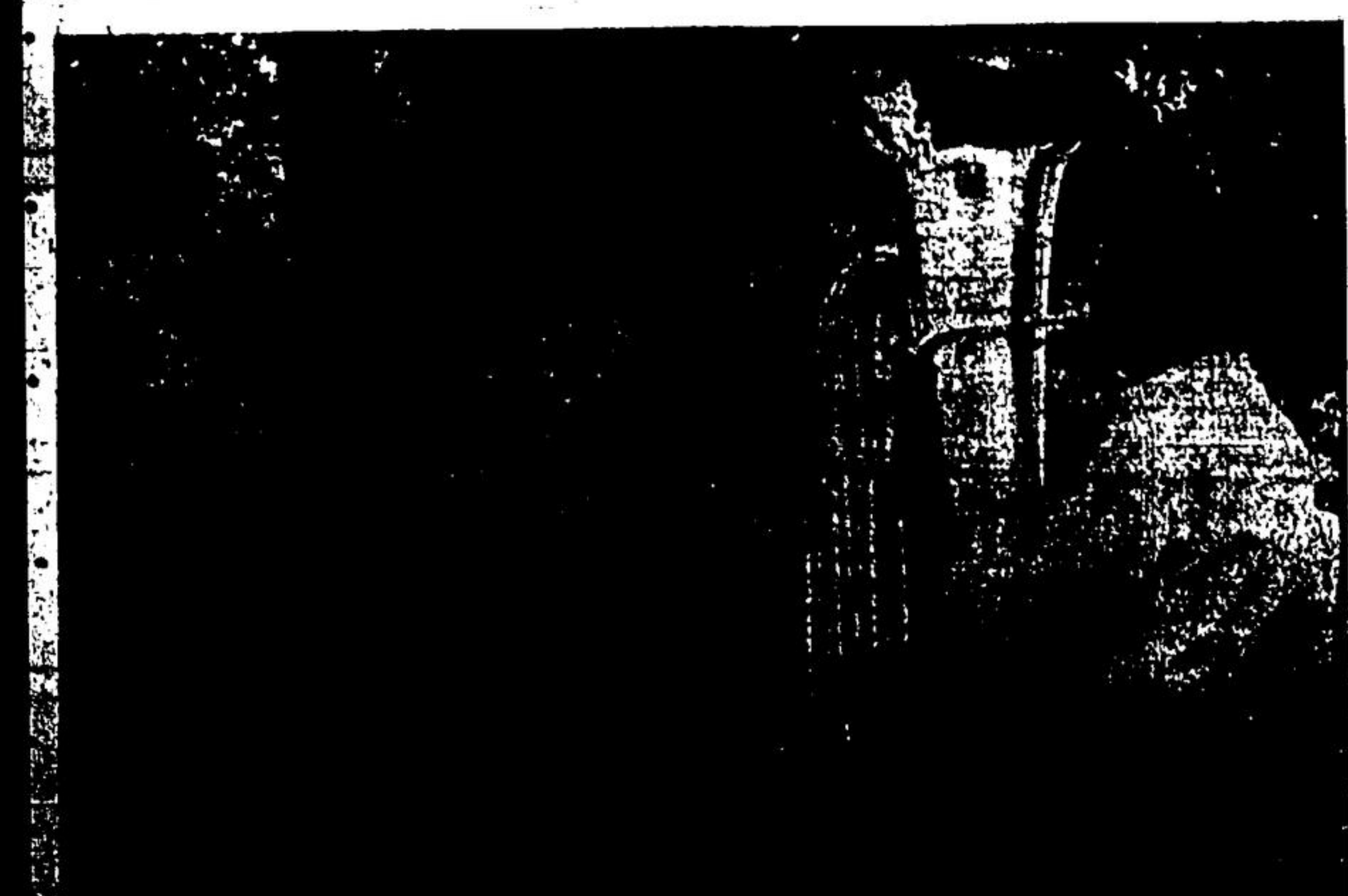
