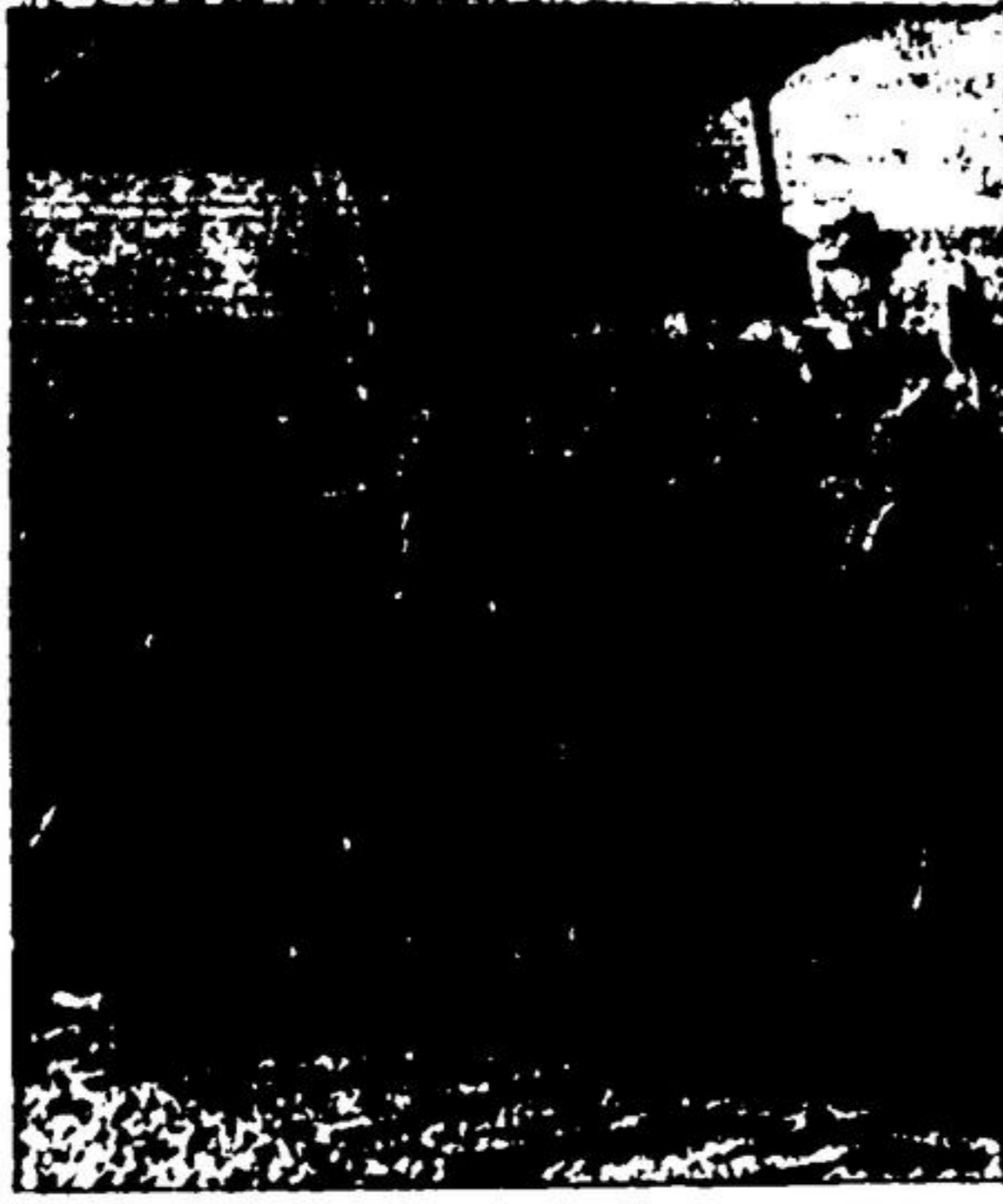


CN'S MOBILE MONSTER MACHINES MOVE ONTO THE JOB

It's been a long process, but Canadian National Railways conversion to double track and automatic switching in the Georgetown area, part of the Toronto Terminal project, is nearing its conclusion. The CN's fleet of monster machines which usually indicate the final operation in laying a new system, have been familiar sights on the 'Hamilton' line which crosses the 7th line of Esplanade near Stewarttown this past week. The machines are gradually working toward the Georgetown yard. At left is a 'tamping' machine which lifts the ties and rails by air pressure so additional ballast can be placed underneath in the levelling operation. Below, the machine with the paddles across the front is a compactor. Bottom left, the rail gap removes ties at the Chack Seven crossing as part of the levelling operation. The men at the extreme left is their foreman. At the right of the picture is part of the new wig-wag and barrier.



AQUA SCHOLARS SHOW THEIR MOXIE IN RED CROSS TESTS

Last week was exam time for the hundred and forty-one swimmers taking lessons at the Georgetown Community Pool and for all but nine of them it was a successful testing. The July enrolment included 8 seniors, 4 intermediates, 41 Juniors and 83 beginners. Here's a sample of the demanding examinations. Seniors were given water safety knowledge tests, and examined in reaching assists, artificial respiration, shallow diving, 100 yds side or breast stroke, 100 yds elementary back stroke or crawl, 100 yds front crawl or trudgen, stride jump into deep water, 25 yards arms only on the back, running dive, surface dive and underwater swim, towing rescue, and a new subject, drownproofing. Lesser classes were given progressively less rigorous tests. At the opposite end of the scale the Beginners were faced with water safety knowledge test, reaching assist, open eyes under water, bobbing six times, jelly fish float, front glide and roll over, swim 20 ft and stand up, turn about, and stand up, jump in, swim in place, or tread water for 30 seconds.
