Suffers Broken Neck, Cuts In Saturday Midnight Flip

An accident near Cedar Springs in the early hours of Sunday morning caused \$700 damage to the cars involved. The drivers, Ross Neil of North Bay, and James Ellison of H.E. Simpson were not seriously hurt. P.C. Y. Penrice evaluated the damage at \$400.

Silver's Branch Store Damaged by Lab Blaze

Silver's Brampton store and a dental lab above it suffered heavy fire, smoke and water damage in a blaze there early Friday morning.

Three pumps, one with an aerial ladder, and 31 firemen raced to the fire at 2:22 a.m. Deputy-chief George Savage said the fire was under control at about 3 o'clock. He estimated damage to the building at \$3,000. Mr. Silver, who also operates a store in Georgetown, was not available to estimate damage to the contents.

An undetermined amount of equipment was lost in the lab which was completely destroyed.

The deputy-chief said the fire may have been touched off by electrical circuits leading to a drying box in the dental lab operated by Charles Landis-Sonne. He started the lab a month ago.
