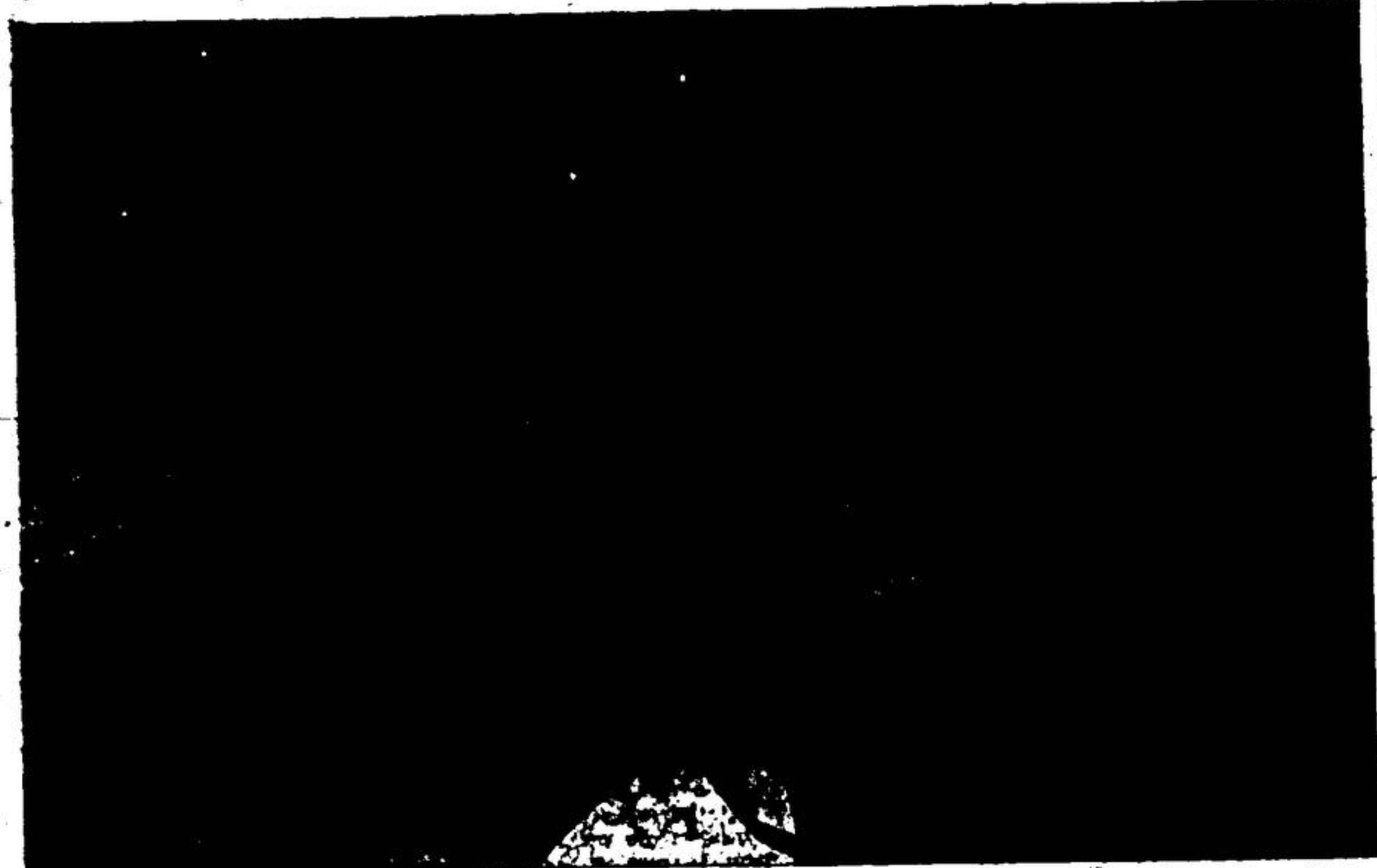

WEEKLY OBSERVATIONS BY DR. HARRY HARLEY, M.P. FOR HALTON

The Government has been accused of a 'filibuster' of silence on the flag issue. If this contradictory term is taken at face value we are accused of prolonging debate by not speaking in the debate. The Government has been accused of showing a flag down the throats of Parliament. One has only to realize this is a minority Government that cannot push any matter unless it gets support from some other Party or some of their Members.

I have received enquiries from Halton regarding the Youth Allowance programme. The programme was designed to extend the Family Allowance programme while quite separate from it. The purpose of the legislation is to encourage Canada's young people to continue in school, thereby better fitting them for future employment.

The allowance is payable at \$10 per month for any child age 16 or 17 who resides in Canada, is being maintained by a parent and who is either in full-time attendance at school or university or is unable to attend school because of a mental or physical infirmity. The latter group of young people were included so that some assistance could be provided to their parents who maintain them.

The Youth Allowances Act is being administered by the Family Allowance and Old Age Security Division of the Dept. of National Health and Welfare. Arrangements have been made by that Division to forward a Youth Allowance application form to all parents in Canada who have a child age sixteen or seventeen. It was possible for them to extract the names of these children from Family Allowance records. This approach was adopted in order to facilitate the making of applications by parents.

Discover 13 Cases TB No Cause For Alarm

There is no cause for alarm in the rise in cases of tuberculosis in Halton county, in the opinion of Dr. Archie F. Bull, director of the Halton County Health Unit. Ewart Carberry, president of the Halton Tuberculosis and Health Association, announced two days ago that there are now about 13 cases of the disease in the county, the highest number in two years. Dr. Bull says that there has been no actual increase in the incidence of tuberculosis when the growth of the county's population is taken into consideration. He explained that variations in the number of cases take place from year to year. "In the province as a whole the number of cases is about the same," he said. "We are not alarmed about the increase in the past year."

Drink More Water. Many persons do not drink sufficient water for the body's needs. Esqueusing Building Permits Total \$58,400 in August. A total of \$58,400 in building permits was issued in Esqueusing township during August. Building Inspector W. Hulls told Esqueusing Council Tuesday night. While most residential development, \$25,000 was for a truck terminal just outside of Acton, issued to Goy Cottage. The centennial grants spark a discussion among the councillors, Halton County Museum Association asked if Esqueusing both property owners adjoining a plan, with the hope that if not, the County could use it to further their centennial project.
