

Ambulance Logged Over 43,000 mi. Lifetime Production Certificate to Nurse

The Georgetown Volunteer Ambulance Service was first organized in January, 1957 and on February 28th the ambulance which had been purchased by the town was officially turned over to the Association.

From the first call on March 8, 1957, until August 20, 1964 a total of 1114 calls were answered, logging over 43,000 miles on the vehicles. With the opening of the Georgetown District Hospital in June 1961, the calls have not decreased, but the distance travelled has reduced, sharply.
