MacDonald thought the NDP victory in the recent Riverdale by-election, and the Liberal defeat in Windsor-Sandwich were indicative of a trend in favor of the N.D.P.

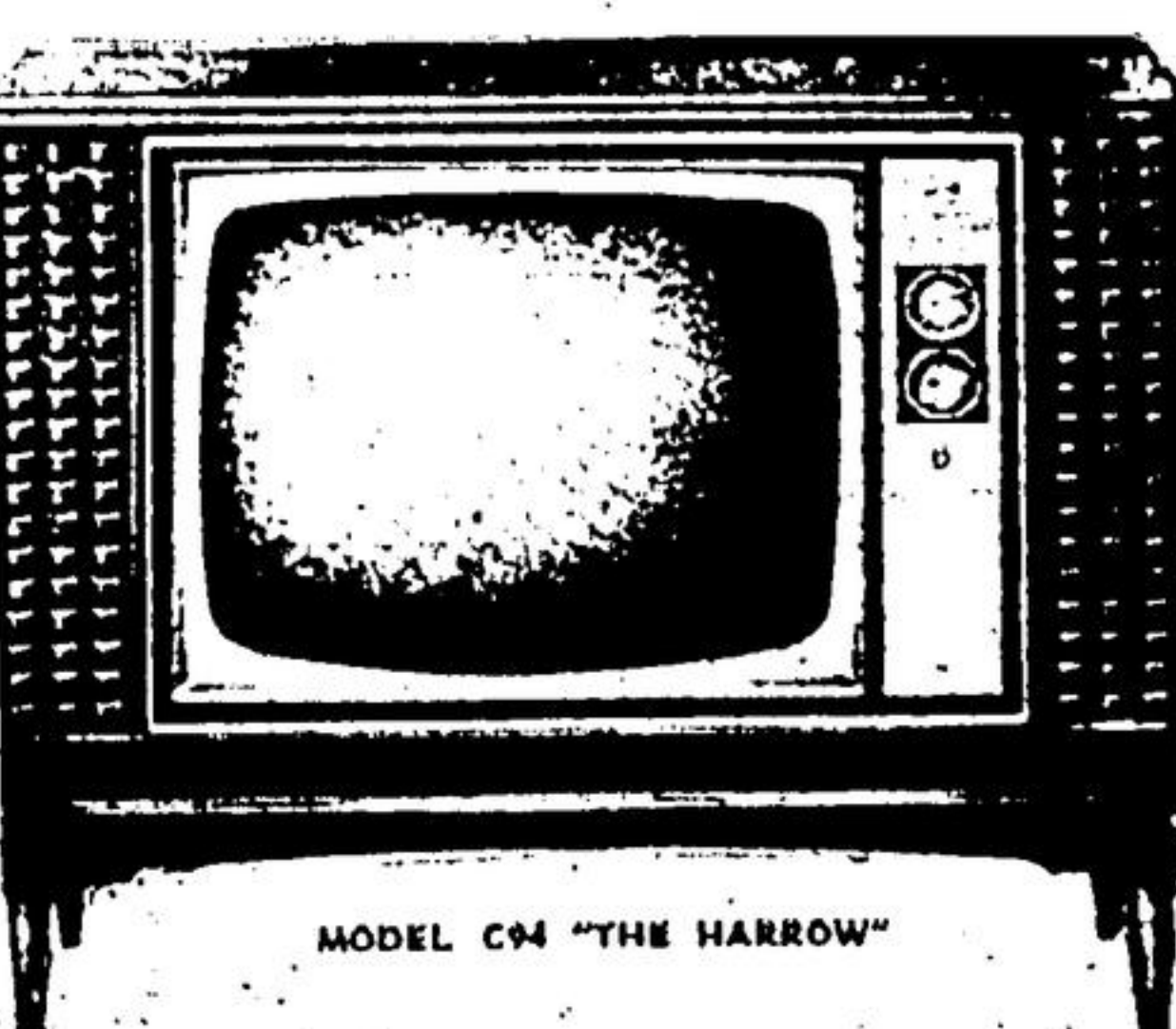

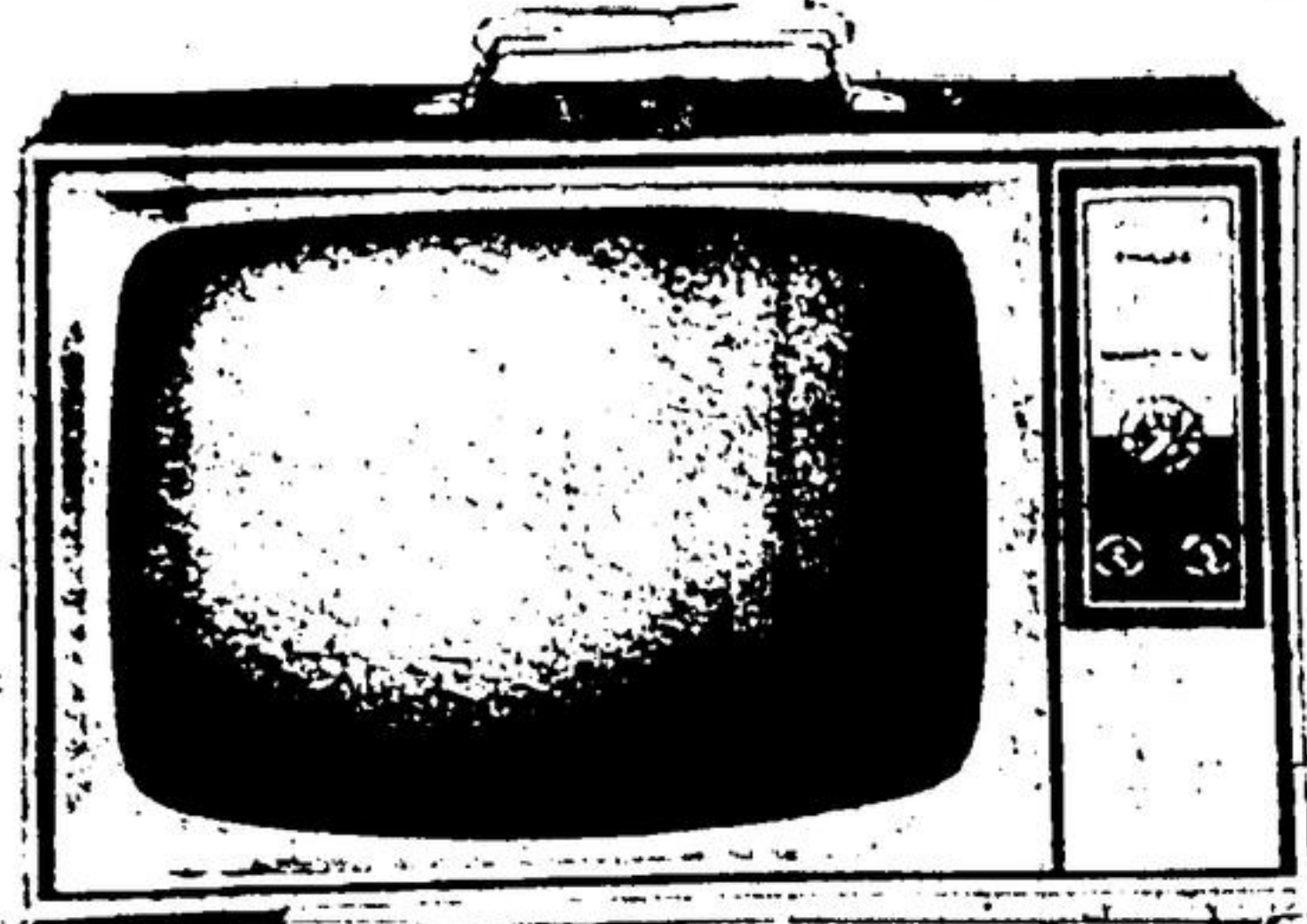

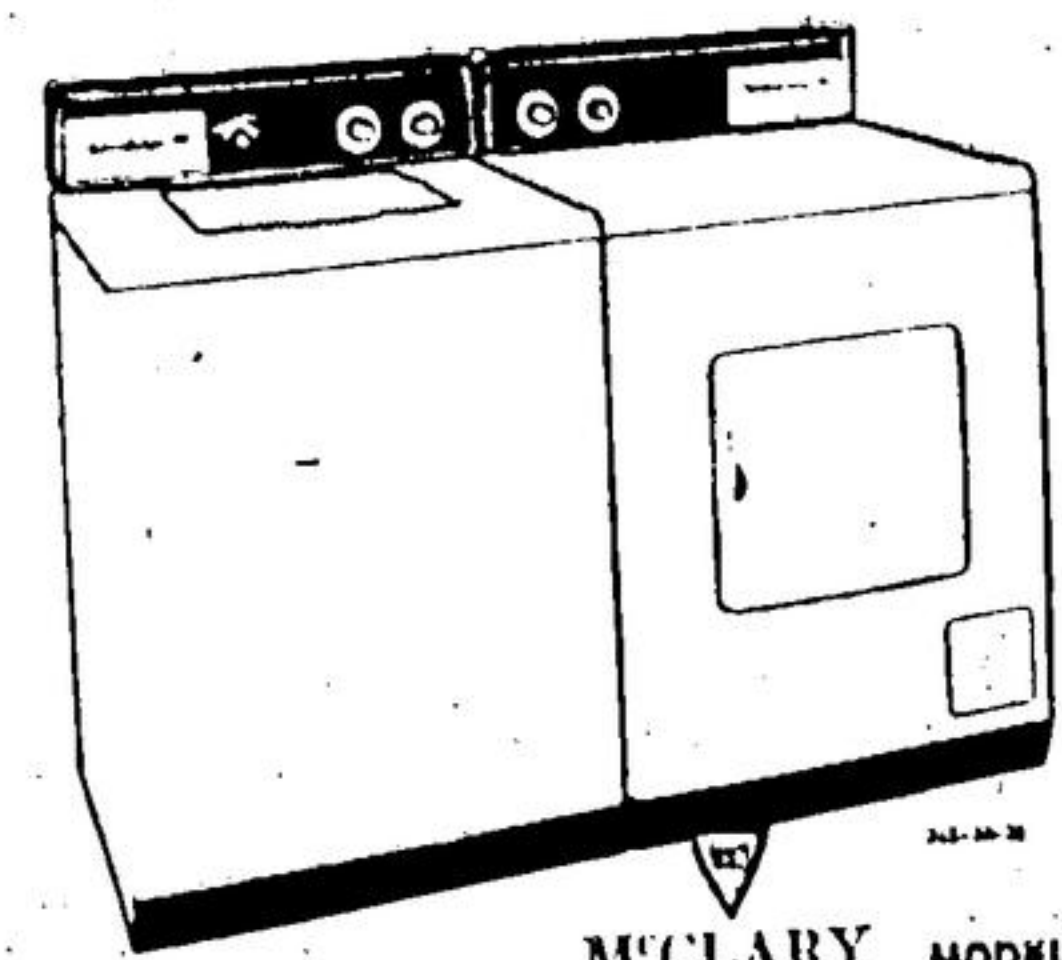
