

Funeral Service at Home Lifetime Norval Resident

A resident of Norval all her life, Jennie G. Barnhill, died at her home in Norval on September 21st in her 94th year. She was the daughter of Margaret Hamilton and George Scott. She was a pupil of the Norval Public School, the Georgetown High School and finished her education at the Normal School in Toronto, after which she taught school at Acton and the fifth line west SS no. 3 Chinguacousy. On June 10, 1913 she became the bride of Everett H. Barnhill who preceded her in 1900, a son

of William Hunter, Douglas Inwood, Melvin Joe, Wilfred Kirkwood, Deanna Robinson, Norman Wilson and Jellian Reed. Interment was in Hillcrest Cemetery, Norval.

Twin Binder Spell-Binder As Taylor Family Reunites

Herbert Taylor of Cheltenham is now the only living member of the family to carry the Taylor name.

This was a special day for Mr. and Mrs. Herbert Taylor, as it was the occasion of their 45th wedding anniversary. The highlight of the afternoon was the old time threshing demonstration, using a wood-fired steam engine which powered a wooden separator. The sheaves were fed by hand after the twine binding them together was cut off by another helper. This threshing outfit is part of a large collection of antiques owned and enjoyed by Mr. Herbert Taylor.

The most interesting part of this threshing machine for the little folk, the great nieces and nephews of Mr. Taylor, was the 'whistle' on the engine, which gave them a 'big thrill'. Three grain sacks filled with

special oats as well as a lovely pile of loose straw was the reward of this threshing effort. Those who were not cutting twine, feeding the sheaves into the cutting box or blowing the chaff were capturing the scene in picture to form a lasting memento of a most interesting and enjoyable afternoon.

Forty-two well-whetted appetites did full justice to a delicious meal, after all had joined in singing "Bless This House" and "Be Present at Our Table Lord" accompanied on the clarinet by Eleanor Johnston of Coleraine.
