

LET'S PLAY BRIDGE

Summer, what there was of it, has passed and another season of duplicate bridge has started at the Acton Bridge Club. The first night saw five tables in play. The winners were Mike Lorusso and Earl Emond, a couple of regulars in the winning slot. For those who are reluctant to try duplicate bridge in case they come last, I will mention that your correspondent came last. I guess it can happen to anyone. Anyone who wishes to be a good bridge player must learn to plan the play of the hand. In planning, it is imperative that you count your tricks. A couple of pairs had trouble with the following hand and I think it was because they didn't count their tricks.

Board No. 13 —
Dealer — North
Both sides vulnerable.

West 4 S-A 5
H-K 3 H-10 7 3
D-10 8 5 2 D-K J 9 7
C-3 C-J 8 7 4

South
S-Q 10 8 3 2
H-A Q 9 6
D-J
C-K Q 10

The bidding:
North East South West
1 D Pass 1 S Pass
2 C Pass 3 H Pass
3 H Pass 4 H All Pass
If you don't agree with North opening the bidding, then South will open. North will then jump and four hearts should be reached as before. Although there is no plan that will absolutely guarantee four hearts, declarer should certainly make some plan. If the heart finesse works and if the king of hearts is doubled or if the 10 falls and if clubs break, then declarer can make his contract by drawing trump.

But that is a lot of "ifs". A far better idea would be to try some sort of a cross ruff. West opens a low diamond and dummy takes the ace. Now leads a spade. If East wins and leads a trump, go up with the ace and lead out your clubs. Take the king and queen of clubs and lead the 10. Whatever West does, you are home free. At the most, you will lose two trump and a spade. At the best, you may only lose one trump and a spade.
