Beavers Hammer Soldiers 41-0 Three Touchdowns by Newman

Last Sunday, Georgetown Beavers travelled to Camp Borden for what was expected to be one of the toughest meetings of the year. Camp Borden had been a very tough squad in the Spring season but due to transfers and overseas postings they had lost several of their top performers, so the team that they fielded, as the 41-0 score indicates, was no match for the eager Beavers.

Georgetown won the toss and elected to play with the wind at their backs to try and get as many points in the first half as possible. As it turned out, the wind was not a completely crushing factor as the Beavers completely crushed all opposition for the first five minutes. Beavers were awarded a penalty kick for an offside infringement at the Borden 30 yard line. Placement specialist Les Judge split the uprights and Beavers led 3-0. In the space of the next 15 minutes, Georgetown added 3 TDs by Newman, Brewer and Heffron. Les Judge converted 2 of them and the score soared to 16-0.

The final scoring play in the 1st half came as the result of a move Beavers have been using to good advantage this year. After the ball had moved out the backs to the winger, who found himself boxed in on the sideline, he crossed kicked to the centre of the field where Russ Bradley following up hard, intercepted a desperate Borden pass in the end zone to count 3 pts.

Les Judge converted Bradley's score and at 4:10 Beavers had a comfortable 21-0 lead.

Some positional changes were made in order to alleviate the risk of aggravating injuries which some of the Beavers had suffered in the past two games. Scrum half Lee moved to fullback, strictly a defensive position, fullback Sandy Mackenzie came into centre three and more action and centre out. Heffron replaced Lee at scrum half. Play in the second half was a repetition of the first half with the local squads forcing the play all the time and scoring at regular intervals with comparative ease.

Newman, Keith Reay, Sandy Mackenzie and Newman again, with Les Judge converting all 4, rounded out the Beaver total. The final score was 41-0 with individual honours going to Roger Newman with 3 TDs and Les Judge with 17 pts. From his educated toe.

Russ Bradley, Ted Clark and Roger Becham all played very strong two-way games with Nick Carter and Gerry Cunningham coming up with their usual steady performance. Beavers host Toronto Irish at Georgetown Park next Sunday at 2:30 and will be trying for their third straight win.

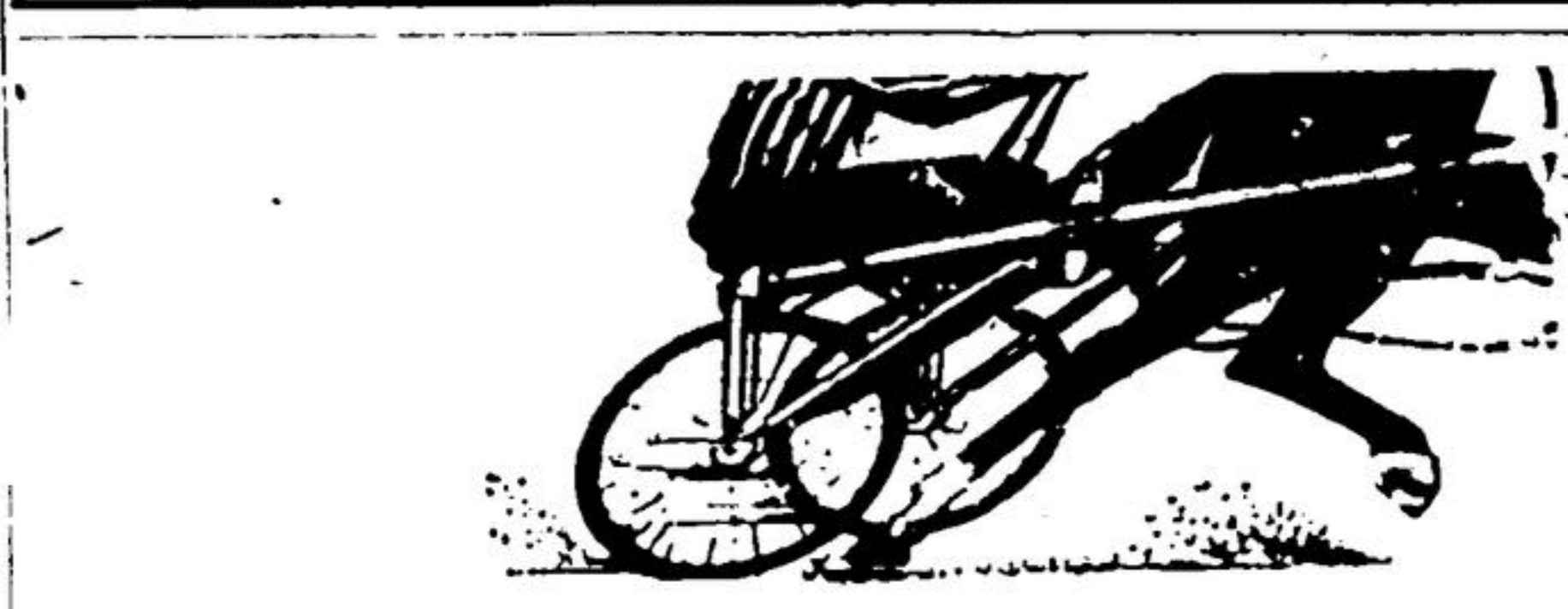
