World Famous Story on the Screen at Maple Ave. Baptist

"In His Steps," a feature-length motion picture based on the world-famous novel of the same name, will be shown on Monday, October 5 at Maple Avenue Baptist Church at 8 p.m.

The story originally appeared as a book around the turn of the century, written by a Topeka clergyman named Charles M. Sheldon. It is reported to have sold over thirty million copies, and has been translated into dozens of languages across the world.

The film story follows the experiences of Rachel Paige, aspiring young actress, newspaper publisher Ed Norman, and Pastor Henry Maxwell, the clergyman whose unique concept changed their lives.

"In His Steps" as a novel came at a time in American history when vigorous social reforms were underway, especially in industrial communities. The film updates these situations, giving the story a contemporary approach.

Last Easter the CBC TV scheduled the film in a national coast to coast telecast. The showing invoked widespread praise and the CBC was deluged with letters from every province expressing their approval.
