**100,000 in Terra Cotta Park During Summer**

This summer close to one hundred thousand people visited Terra Cotta and Balfountain Conservation areas. According to Deputy Treasurer G. W. Bentley, there were twenty two thousand cars with each car containing 4.5 visitors on the average.

This figure is roughly the same as last year. For the first half of the summer, this year was running well ahead but the cool August evening them out. The biggest single day at Terra Cotta was July 28th, when 850 cars, plus the campers entered the gate.
