Beavers Still Unbeaten Win Against Toronto Irish

Beavers maintained their unbeaten record by the narrowest of margins by beating the Irish 6-3 at the Park on Sunday. No other team has extended the Beavers' to the same extent this season.
The Georgetown team, won the toss and elected to play with a very high wind at their backs, hoping to pile up a good score before the half time. However, Irish played a good forward game and held firm despite several good attempts by Beavers, to score from close in. Les Judge kicked a goal from a penalty on Irish 35 yds. in, and this score held until the 45 min. mark.
On changing ends Irish, weary of the close tackling displayed by the locals, began to loft the ball into Beavers' end, where Sandy Mackenzie was playing his usual steady game, fending off one thrust after another. This kept the ball in the area between the 25 yard lines for long periods, until the referee, John Alliban one of the finest officials in Canadian Rugby made one of his rare errors, and awarded Irish a penalty which just scooped in, to tie the score 13-13.
Trev Sampson Beavers skipper doing a fine job of tongue lashing shamed his squad into a big final surge. Paul Barber made a devastating 60 yd. run to Irish 5 yd line which set the pace till the end of the game. But Irish luck held until the final minute of the game. The move that put Beavers ahead started with Sandy Mackenzie fielding a punt by Irish, he feinted to the left touch line, then applied the boot straight up the centre of the field, Roger Newman was right up with the ball and sealing an Irish fumble began one of the most dazzling displays of broken field running ever seen, to take and straight arm his way past 8 Irish defenders and give Beavers a 6-3 lead. Les Judge missed the easy shot at conversion right in front of the posts. However the final whistle blew with the missed goal kick and Beavers had made it.
