Proposed Road Closing Is Opposed at Norval

commented Cr. G. Currie.

The proposed closing of the original road allowance of No. 10 sideroad through the Norval Cemetery brought thirteen ratepayers to Equeston Council meeting. — The largest delegation in years.

The bylaw was given first reading, then the Reeve asked if anyone wished to speak to it. Terence Balnes, appears on behalf of Mr. and Mrs. G. Caskey, told Council that for at least twenty five years the Caskeys had been using a laneway from the Concession Road to a garage at the back. This bylaw would prevent them from doing so.

He pointed out that if the road were stopped up, it would be understandable if the Caskeys asked for compensation or rearrangement. In concluding he suggested the road remain the way it is at present.
