The proposed closing of the original road allowance of No. 10 sidewalk through the Norval Cemetery brought thirteen ratepayers to Esquimaux Council meeting — The largest deputation in years.

The one item was a Boy Scout meeting hall which will be built on the 5th line, in Limehouse, near the Co-Kart track. The cost is estimated at \$3000.
Mr. P. Hicks, lot 6, Concession 3, complained to Council of the severe shock waves from the blasting at Associated Quarries. He claimed that the severe blasts occur once every two weeks. He suggested that Council could set a limit on the size of the blasts, and stop them during heavy overcast weather. "I feel they are a public nuisance," he concluded. Coun. Currie explained that any time in the past that Council has asked any of the quarries to cut down on the blasting, they have had no operation. The Reeve promised they would see what could be done.
