Georgetown voters will have a choice of at least three men when they mark their ballots for mayor on December 5.

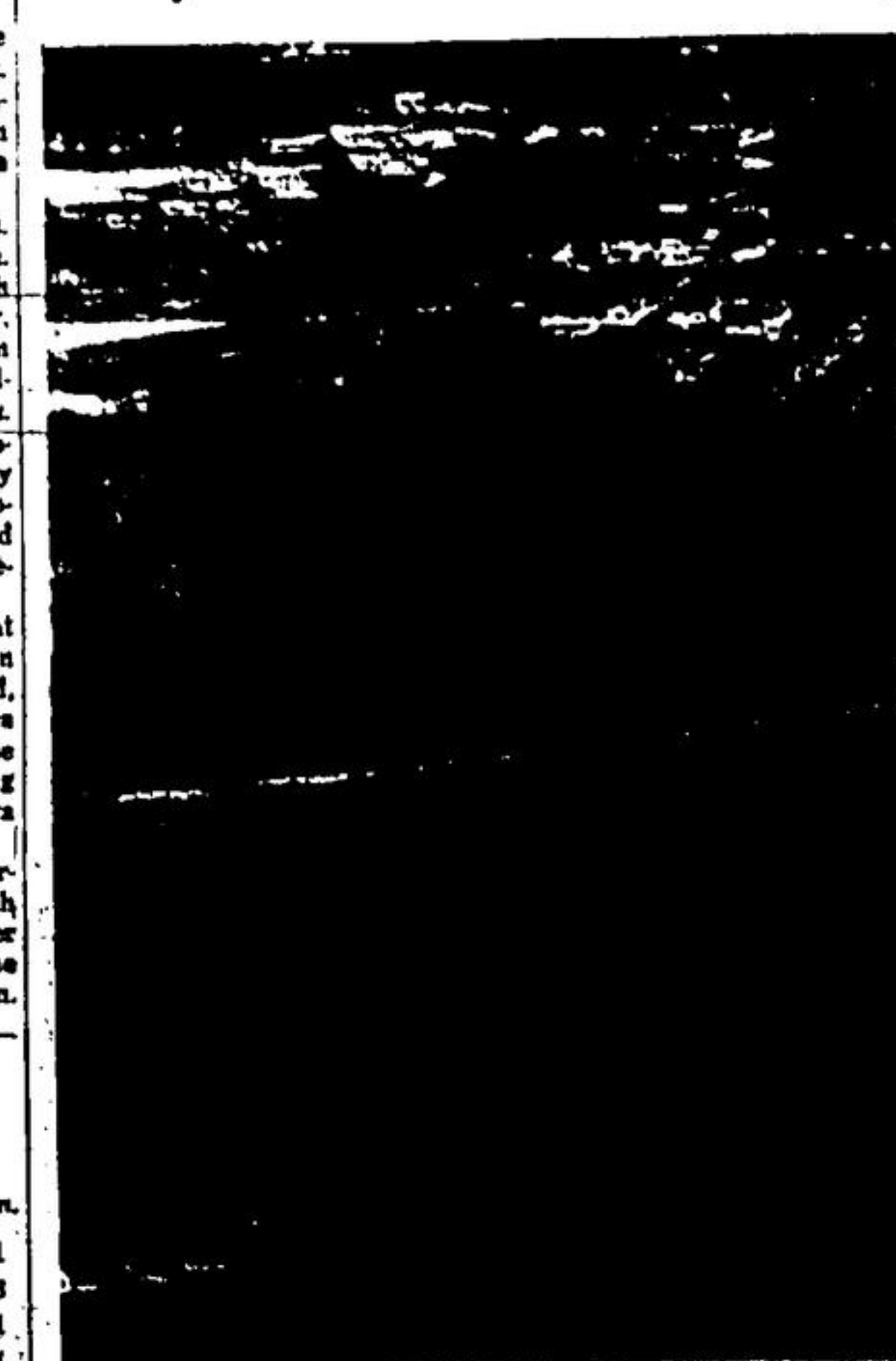
Registration Down, Seek More for Figure Skating
