In Town Mayoralty Race Hyde Announces Try Again

Dear Mr. Editor:

Once again we approach THAT time of year when the local scene and local politics are uppermost in the minds of the Citizens of Georgetown. This is the time to assess what has been done, what has been accomplished, have we as a Municipality gone forward, is the financial position improved, OK!!! and if it is, OK something else, then, for the good of the Town the less said the better, and we can only look to a new and another year.

It is always hard to lose, and last election was no exception to me, however, when you lose you should learn something from it and try to bounce back. That is exactly what I am doing now, and in the past few weeks many have asked "Are you going to run for Mayor this year?" and may I take this opportunity to say YES, I will be a Mayoralty Candidate and I look forward to your confidence and support.

It is my intention to start an early campaign, but it is not my intention to campaign on hollow promises. I honestly do not feel that our present tax rate can be lowered without placing the Town in financial jeopardy, I do feel however that our present tax rate MUST NOT INCREASE, and I KNOW it can be held and I KNOW to hold this present rate will take a great deal of careful planning and cooperation among ALL members of Council.

Within a very few years, and I would say less than four, Georgetown could be in a position, not only to start a downward trend in the tax rate but also carry on with the many civic improvements that are so badly needed and again I say this could be the position, however this will not be easy, it just isn't going to happen automatically. Ideally, it is going to take hard work, planning and careful management. There is one magic thing that will speed this on and that is the long promised and long looked for INDUSTRIAL GROWTH.

Wherever you go you will hear these words "what is the reason we are not getting industry" and there definitely is a reason and there is also a cure, it will serve no purpose to diagnose the reason but we must go on with the cure, AVAILABLE, COMPETITIVE INDUSTRIAL LAND, there are three known ways to bring this about, either through purchase, re-zoning or annexation and the sooner this is studied and resolved the sooner we are on our way to a better balanced Town, and a lower tax rate. This can be done without hardship, it will urmalice to our present developer and this should be the first approach, however one thing MUST BE DONE, and this is a PROMISE I will make.

In my past terms as Mayor, I do not claim that I have not made mistakes (there is only one sure way of not making a mistake and that is No nothing at all however, I do claim that Georgetown is better off financially at the end of my terms than it was at the beginning.

I thank you for your attention and I look forward to meeting you, the Electors of the Town of Georgetown and discuss with you the future of OUR TOWN.

Halton's Kerr in Running Cabinet Transport Post

Halton County may be honored with its first cabinet appointment if the anticipated shakeup of cabinet personnel by Premier John Roberts takes place.

Mr. Roberts is expected to enter a three-day party caucus this week with cabinet changes as his prime target. Halton M.L.A. George Kerr is being mentioned prominently as a possible new Minister of Transport, replacing Hon. Irwin Hackett.

This possibility is discounted in many quarters, however, including George Kerr himself. Frankly admitting that he is interested in a cabinet post in general, and the Transport Ministry in particular, Mr. Kerr said:

"I personally think my chances of being appointed a minister in the near future are very slight."

He noted that Mr. Hackett has only held the ministerial post for the past 12 months, he declared. "There is little likelihood of his being replaced at this time."

Kerr said that there are a number of very able veterans in the government who are acting as committee chairmen and on various commissions that would naturally be promoted to head a ministry. "Naturally, I am interested in a cabinet appointment," he added. "I would accept an appointment as Minister of Transport firstly, Reform Institutions or Labor, but I can see absolutely no chance of this at the present time."
