WILL BE 18 HOLES

Shareholders Give Green Light To New North Halton Course

Shareholders in the North Halton Golf and Curling Club on Maple Ave. voted Wednesday night, Oct. 21 to proceed immediately with the first phase of a construction program which will convert the golf course to an 18 hole layout.

The first phase includes constructing the first half of the new course which will embrace two existing golf holes and seven completely new.

Cost of the first phase is not to exceed \$37,000. The vote is in accordance with the club by-law carried by a majority of over two-thirds of the shareholders.

The to Greens Limited has the construction contract. Architects Moute Associates Limited designed the layout.

Total yardage will be 6,500 and the par 72. One of the existing nine holes, the first, will become a practice fairway and green; two will be incorporated into the front nine, some will be torn up, and only two will lie dormant waiting for the second stage of the program.

The balance of the plan will be tackled in two more phases which, as one shareholder put it, "will be undertaken as membership demand indicates."
