## 21 Register For St. John's First Aid Course

Twenty one men are presently enrolled in the St. John's Ambulance course being held weekly in the Georgetown Volunteer Ambulance Corp headquarters.

Conducting the course is Divisional Officer Fred Couley, who has been a member of the Association for twenty years. Over the last four years he has been instructing in Markham, Acton and Georgetown.

"We teach the basic first aid—adult course which covers most emergencies," says Mr. Couley, "and equally important, it teaches when not to do anything."

The class runs for eight weeks, at a cost of five dollars per person. At the end of this time, if the test given by a doctor is passed, a St. John's Ambulance certificate is awarded.

With this certificate, anyone can then become a member of the Brigade. These are the men you see on duty at public gatherings. The local Brigade numbers twenty-seven, the Fall and Churchwagon races, among other things. They also travel to any neighbouring area, on a voluntary basis.

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
