


Gold at the End of Their Rainbow

## Plans Fade for Maple Leaf Hornby Stadium

Cows will graze where the Toronto Baseball Maple Leafs might have played.

Last week, plans for the construction of a \$3,000,000, twenty thousand seat major league stadium at Hornby were cancelled.

The Oakville parks board, which holds that fate of the property, cancelled the grand scheme when they approved plans for a \$500 softball diamond on part of the land and decided to rent the balance as cattle pasture for an annual rental fee of \$200.

The action apparently means the end of all hopes for a major league baseball stadium in the Hornby area.

Last April, possibility of the dreamed of stadium being constructed in this area to attract a major league team was seriously discussed.

Frank Pollock, general manager of the Toronto Maple Leafs came out to visit the site near the 7th line and Highway 401, last spring.

Last week the Board passed a motion to contact the Halton County Conservation Authority about the possibility of constructing a dam in the park area.

It was pointed out that such a dam would not only provide a good skating area during the winter but could help provide better water facilities for nearby Perry W. Merry School.

It was suggested that the Parks Board and the School Board approach the Conservation Authority together on the possibility of such a project.
