

Red and Blue Seniors Cop CWOSSA Volleyball

The Central Western Ontario Secondary School Association "A" level girls volleyball championship rests in Georgetown today the property of the GHS Girls.

The Red and Blue Seniors battled each and six other division champions in a bid to win the title for the first time in the school's history. Last year, Georgetown was placed in a lower league, CWOSSA B.

The A showdown was at the Ontario Agricultural College, Guelph.

The GHS crew ticked off easy wins against Galt (20-10), Kitchener Waterloo (26-18), Owen Sound (28-0), Brantford (28-10), Orangeville (28-15), and Paris (28-19).

To enter the final Georgetown Seniors defeated 2 Guelph schools in a district round robin tourney, knocking their way into the final of a winning streak of eight against the best competition in this part of the province.

The group coach is Mrs. W. Thompson.

22. But they went winless in their next four matches against Orangeville, Wiltchener-Windsor, Galt Collegiate and Brantford.

But weakened or not Georgetown carried the play for two periods. They owned a 2-1 edge after forty minutes but their two lines couldn't keep pace with the fully staffed New Hamburg club.

Despite the third period collapse, Cuthbert in the Beaver goal played well. He got his most support from defenseman Brent Telford and Wayne Riddall, and Dave Sheppard also played an above-par defensive game.

New Hamburg scored their go-ahead goals late in the game, and Georgetown's bid to pull even was squashed with a minute left by a Beaver penalty.

One of the tougher clubs in the league, Simcoe, meets the Beavers in the Memorial arena this Sunday afternoon.
