

### Extra \$2.50 for Scouts Brings Parent Protest

A levy of \$2.50 on top of the \$2.50 registration fee for local Scouts and Cubs will stick despite protests from parents at a general meeting of the District Scout Council in Knox Church Hall last week.

Parents may pay the new levy in instalments, but the extra money is necessary to handle numerous extra expenses. In the past much of the expense had been handled through fund raising projects, but there have not been as many such projects this year, and as one Scout official put it, "the money has to come from somewhere."

The District affected by the levy includes Georgetown groups 1st to 7th, Ashgrove,

pointed members are eligible to sit on the council but meetings this year have been unable to attract a quorum in most cases. The average attendance per monthly meeting has been less than ten and in some cases as few as two have showed up.

The District Council was even unable to raise a quorum for the annual meeting last May. The Council is made up of ten officers plus a representative from each group in the District.

About 125 parents, Rover, and leaders attended the general meeting, and heard the Ontario Executive explain the importance of a good District Council.
