Employment Activity Is Encouraging In The District

Employment activity continued to be encouraging last month. 349 applicants were placed in employment by the NES during November.

The leading industrial classification was manufacturing which accounted for 156 placements. Sixty five placements were made in construction, followed by 54 in wholesale and retail trade, and 46 in service occupations.

There were 1069 persons registered for work at the month end, nearly identical to the figure in November, 1962, of this total 539 were unplaced female workers as opposed to 478 at the same time last year.

This increase resulted from a higher than usual number of women seeking work for the Christmas season.

Hepatitis Case Reported Here

A case of infectious hepatitis was discovered at one of Georgetown public schools in late November. It was revealed this week in principal reports at the December public school board meeting.

The case was isolated and according to the Halton County Health office there have been no other hepatitis cases reported.

The health office said there was another case at Arton at about the same time as the Georgetown case.
