(Continued from page 13) **drugs** who would benefit by the workshop.

"Others have left without graduating because they reached 18," she said. "I can think of four of them right now."

Mrs. Treash added that many persons are not needed to set up a workshop. She said that it could be run on the same lines as the school where there is one teacher to every five pupils. And this isn't three per cent of North Halton so there are many children who aren't at the school.

Many of these Mrs. Treash said are old enough to take advantage of workshop facilities when they are set up.

The association hopes to be able to secure a room or two where the work shop could be established. Then it will seek right factory work — some that are like stuffing envelopes.

A firm would pay the school for getting the work done and in turn would pay the workers a sum corresponding to the work they produce. A teacher would train the retarded children and slow learners to do the job and have them under constant supervision.
