## Second Loss For PeeWees—Drop to No. 2 Position

Oakville Mustangs moved into first place in the Tri-County PeeWee league with an impressive 4-1 victory over Georgetown.

The loss was the second of the year for Georgetown. Mustangs have dropped just one decision.

Don Desmond, Mike Ver, Robbie Rodshaw, and Green Liley counted Oakville markers. Fendley betted the lone Georgetown marker.

"This was our best game of the year," commented winning manager, Bud Brockway later. "We're really starting to come together."

Every player on the club played up to par, according to Brockway.

"We went there to win and did it," he added.

The game remained scoreless until the 5:30 when point man Robbie Rodshaw clicked on a play started by Greg Pool and Mike Vay.

Desmond clicked with a power play goal at the 11:08 mark of the same period to widen the lead. Dave Sherlock and Paul Ferras picked up assists.

Another power play goal finally put Georgetown on the score sheet before the period ended. Fendley scored from Llewellyn and Korzack.

## Use International Rules In 4 Team "Fun" League

Hockey for the sheer fun of the game - that's how Georgetown players describe the League that they play in weekly at Streetsville or in Georgetown. The four team loop's distinguishing feature is that games are played under International Rules with body checking allowed in the defending team's zone only, and automatic icing the major difference.

## Many Penalties Disrupt Juvenile Game, Lose 2-1

Georgetown Juveniles amassed 97 minutes in penalties including three game misconducts in one of the worst exhibitions of hockey ever played in Tri-County this or any other season. On the Hespeler side of the ledger was a total of 37 minutes in penalties. A brawl capped the whole mess. Incidentally Hespeler won the affair 2 to 1.

Georgetown's offenders were Gary "Shack" Briggs who incurred for a two minute sentence in the first period, scripped with Hespeler's line, then drew a 10 minute misconduct and kept at it for a game misconduct.
