Now Lou Fontinato Coaches His Hornets Meet Beavers

Lou Fontinato, former defenseman great with the New York Rangers and Montreal Canadiens will turn his Orangeville Hornets loose on the Georgetown Beavers in the first Junior C game of 1965 here January 3. Fontinato was knocked from the playing ranks by a freak injury.

Fontinato who had more than his share of penalties in the National Hockey League, has a different outlook as a coach.

Fontinato, who set a record for the number of penalties in one season, is coach of Orangeville Hornets in the Ontario Hockey Association Junior C Series.

He has almost recovered from the near-crippling injury he suffered while playing with Montreal Canadiens during the 1962-63 season. The former New York Ranger smashed two vertebrae in his spine, leaving him almost completely paralyzed. He spent several months in a cast that covered his entire upper body and needed a year of therapy to regain use of his limbs.

Winner of district 10 vs. winner 11 (home and home) Feb. 24th and 26th.

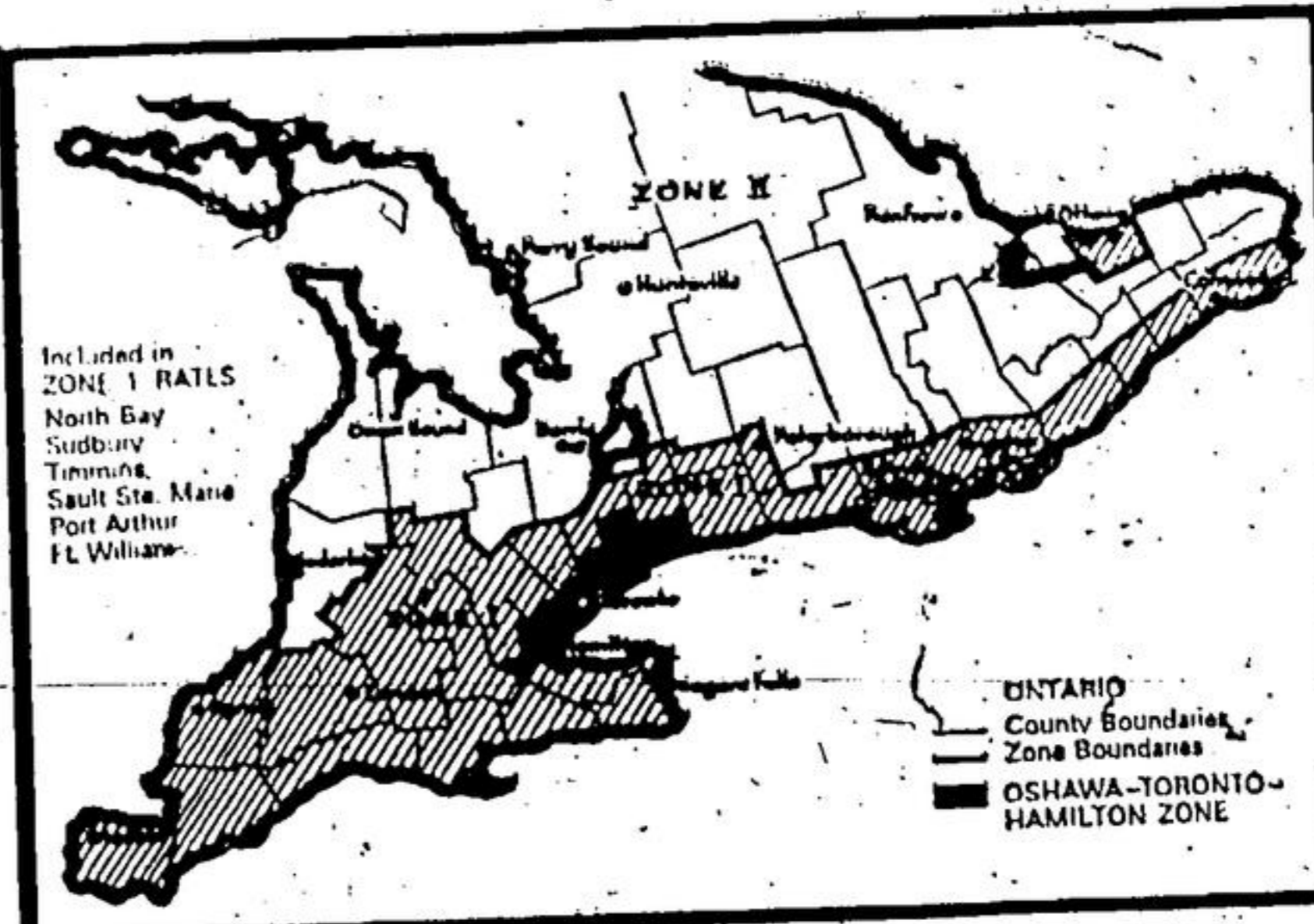
Minimum Wage levels will rise on Dec. 28, 1964

A Reminder—A Minimum wage of \$1.00 an hour is being introduced by stages for both men and women workers throughout Ontario.

The next stage in this progression occurs on December 28, 1964, when the following Minimum Wage rates will be effective.

ZONE 1—Southern Ontario and Major Northern Ontario Cities: Men—\$1.00 per hour, Women—.95 per hour. Construction continues at \$1.25 per hour.

ZONE 2—Northern Ontario, except Major Cities: Men—.90 per hour, Women—.80 per hour. Construction continues at \$1.15 per hour.
