




Minimum Wage levels will rise on Dec. 28,1964

A Reminder—A Minimum wage of \$1.00 an hour is being introduced by stages for both men and women workers throughout Ontario.

. The next stage in this progression occurson December 28, 1964, when the following Minimum Wage rates will be offective.

ZONE 1-Southern Ontario and Major Northern Ontario Cities: Men-\$1.00 per hour, Women -. 95 per hour. Construction continues at \$1.25 per hour.

ZONE 2-Northern Ontario, except Major_c_ Cities: Men-.90 per hour, Women-.90 per hour, Construction continues at \$1.15 per hour.
