Each person sixteen years of age or over, breaking a limb in a farm accident in 1965 in Halton County, will receive a five dollar grant. This motion was passed at the Joint Annual Meeting of the Halton and Peel Farm Safety Councils, held in the Agricultural Office, Milton, on Tuesday, December 15th. Detailed information on the accident must be supplied to the Halton Farm Safety Council. The main purpose for this motion is to focus attention on the high cost and number of broken arms and legs. Guest speakers at the meeting included Mr. Oscar Snyder, Elmira, President, and Mr. Hal Wright, Guelph, Secretary of the Ontario Farm Safety Council of Ontario. Chairman, Mrs. A. R. Coulter, Campbellville R.R. 3, welcomed the Safety Council members from Halton and Peel counties, and told of the accomplishments of the Halton Farm Safety Council during 1964. Larry Argue, Engineering Extension Specialist, and Secretary of the Peel Farm Safety Council, reported on the Peel county activities. A new film was shown - "Elmer, the Safety Elephant".
