Georgetown Beavers are halting 500 in OHA Central Junior C League play after 16 games. Their record became 8 wins and as many defeats Sunday when they took an 11-4 routing from the defending league titleists in Hespeler. The win gave Hespeler 22 points and allowed them to keep pace with Simcoe which leads the pack with 26. Despite the loss Georgetown clung to the third place rung tied with New Hamburg and Dundas however both these clubs have games in hand. Terry Hay and Rod Presswood accounted for all four Georgetown markers. Both scored in the second and third periods. The champions built a 2-0 lead in the first period, extended it to 6-3 in the second and outscored Beavers 5-2 in the finale. Georgetown had enough of the play to make it a different story but lacked the scoring punch when in close. Shots on goal give the Beavers a 41-40 edge.

There were 32 penalties in the chippy contest and they were evenly split. Beavers' Murray Marchant and Hespeler's Park touched off a winner donnybrook when they traded punches in the penalty box late in the game. It was climax to a feud that smouldered throughout the game. Aside from the 2 goal performances by Terry Hay and Rod Presswood Beavers' only other standout was Doug Selby who picked up three assists. Cuthbert was in the Beaver net.
