Manor, Kelso Dam Receive Government Okay, Assistance

Two Halton County projects this week received approval and assistance from the Provincial Government. George Kerr, M.P.P., announced today... A Commitment to Make a Loan has been approved in respect to the construction of a 150 bed-care Home for the Aged and alterations to the present Halton Centennial Manor. The new bed-care units to be two storey brick construction, adjacent to the present Home. The total cost is \$1,473,273.00 with a Provincial Loan of \$736,638.00 which is 50 per cent of the estimated cost of the project.

Construction is to commence immediately and is scheduled to be completed early in 1966. Mr. Kerr pointed out that if the work was completed by April 1st, 1966, the province would forgive 25 per cent of the loan. The second project receiving Provincial assistance is also in the Milton area. A commitment has been made for the construction of a pump-house at Kelso Dam Site. Work is to include miscellaneous piping, electrical controls and wet well with 50,000 gallon capacity. The total cost of the project is \$56,000 and the amount of the loan is \$27,333. Mr. Kerr indicated that construction would commence in this project immediately and is expected to be completed early in 1966.

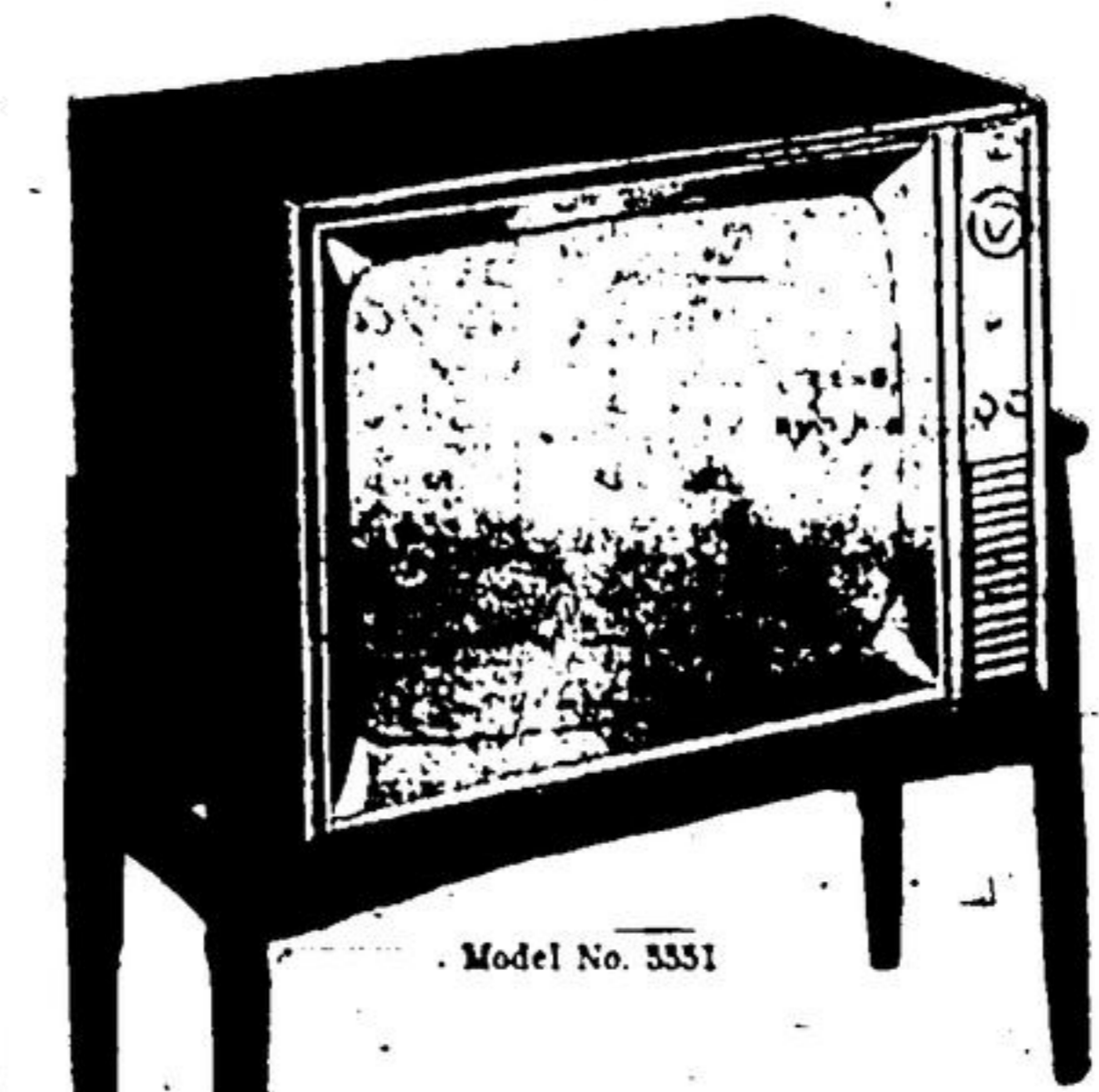

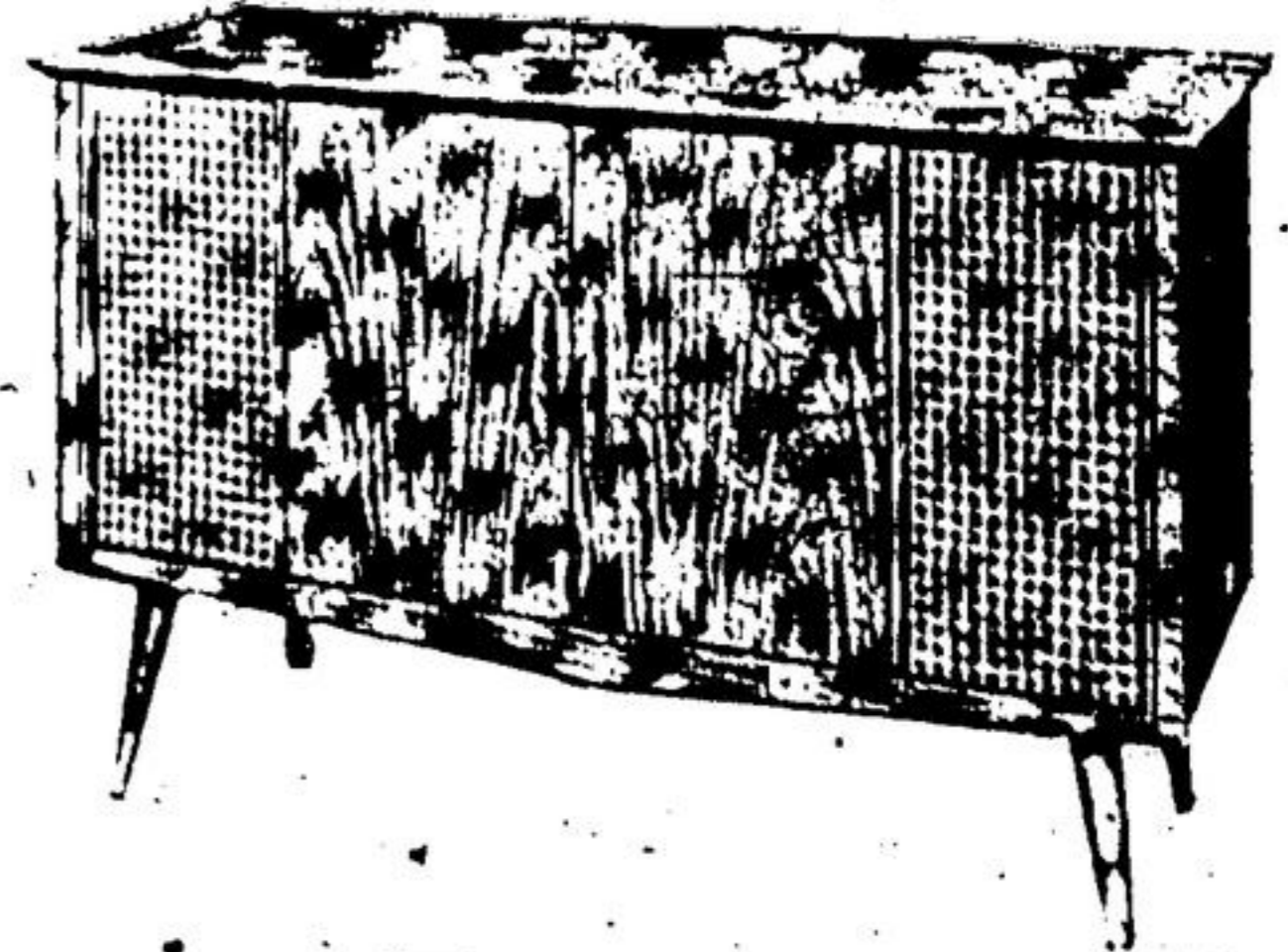
