## Gudgeon Picked For Dream Team

This season he made the dream team at right wing where he has been playing for the Brampton 7 Ups. It is expected the League All-Star team will play last year's championship West club for charity.

Terry Lane and Murray Marchment each came through with four point performances as Georgetown Beavers shocked Hespeler 9-5 in an O.H.A. Junior C Central League game here Friday night.

The win moved Georgetown to within 4 points of third New Hamburg and 6 points of second place Hespeler. Beavers record is now 10 wins and 9 losses for 30 points. Still netting the pace is Simcoe with 15 wins and 3 defeats for 30 points.

Georgetown outscored last season's champions in every period, although the visitors scored first in each frame.

A score by Miller from Parkes at 6:42 gave Hespeler their only lead of the afternoon, but Beavers scored twice as the period closed. Norton from Marchment and Campbell at 18:05 and Marchment from Lane at 19:42.

Main scored from Parkes at 4:21 to start the second period sniping. Lane from Marchment made it 3-2 Georgetown at 7:46 but Hespeler drew even a second time at 8:15 when Loewen scored from Parkes. Georgetown was able to take a 3-2 lead when Lane scored again from Norton at 10:32 and Popel scored from Lane at 16:48.

Hespeler took just 23 seconds to hit the mark in the final period. Main nothing his second unassisted, but Georgetown rebounded with two quick goals in 18 seconds. Dave Sheppard banged the first home at 4:10 and Marchment backed that up with his second goal at 4:26 to give Beavers a 7-4 cushion.

After assisting on 3 goals, Parkes came through on his own to score Hespeler's 5th marker at 13 minutes even. Forty-five seconds later Wayne Riddall netted Georgetown's

5th goal from Burke. Norton scored number 8 in the first minute of play from Lane and Popel.

Hespeler drew 14 penalties to Georgetown's 11. Parkes and Main were stand-outs for Hespeler. Norton, Lane, Popel, Marchment and Cuthbert in the Beaver net were Georgetown's best.

Lou Fontaine and his Orangeville Hornets return here this Sunday, Jan. 17. Beavers are in Hanover Tuesday, Jan. 18, and their Milton rivals currently in 7th place in the loop go here Sunday, Jan. 24.
