


SIGN OF SPRING

Hay is the Straw That Breaks Merchants Backs

A win streak by Milton Merchants was snapped at three games by Georgetown Beavers Sunday afternoon when the Georgetown Junior C club edged their rival 4-3. It was the third Beaver win in three meetings between the two teams. They clash again in Milton tomorrow night (Friday).

A first-year junior, Terry Hay, netted the winning goal in the second period and the teams battled through a scoreless third period. Georgetown, playing without Bill Campbell who had scored seven goals in the past two games, still had the lion's share of the play but failure to finish good scoring chances kept things in doubt right to the end.

Beavers helped build a frantic finish by picking up two penalties in the late minutes of the third period and while it held the crowd in place it failed to produce the tying goal though Milton pressed hard.

The minor calls were only the second and third served by Beavers players in a fast and relatively penalty-free contest.

The victory left Beavers with a record of 12 wins, 10 losses and a tie for 25 points, good enough for fifth place in the eleven team OHA Junior C Central League.

Milton Merchants who have played one more game than Beavers have 9 wins and 15 losses for 18 points and are lodged in 8th position.

The Merchants had the lead twice in the second period, but Georgetown reaped home a pair of rapid-fire tallies less than two minutes apart to steal it away. The first period ended with the teams deadlocked 1-all.

Glen Cooper put Georgetown in front at 3:06 of the first period, but Milton evened things at 6:02 when Horne scored from Bouchard.

Milton went into a 2-lead in Keane's goal from Horne at 3:36 of the second and that stood up until Jan Popiel scored from Don Norton and Rod Preswood at 7:40. Sticks from Marshall and Wildfang regained Milton's edge at 13:21.
