Cheryl Cooper has been in Georgetown Hospital having tonsils removed. We hope she is well and able to be back at school soon.

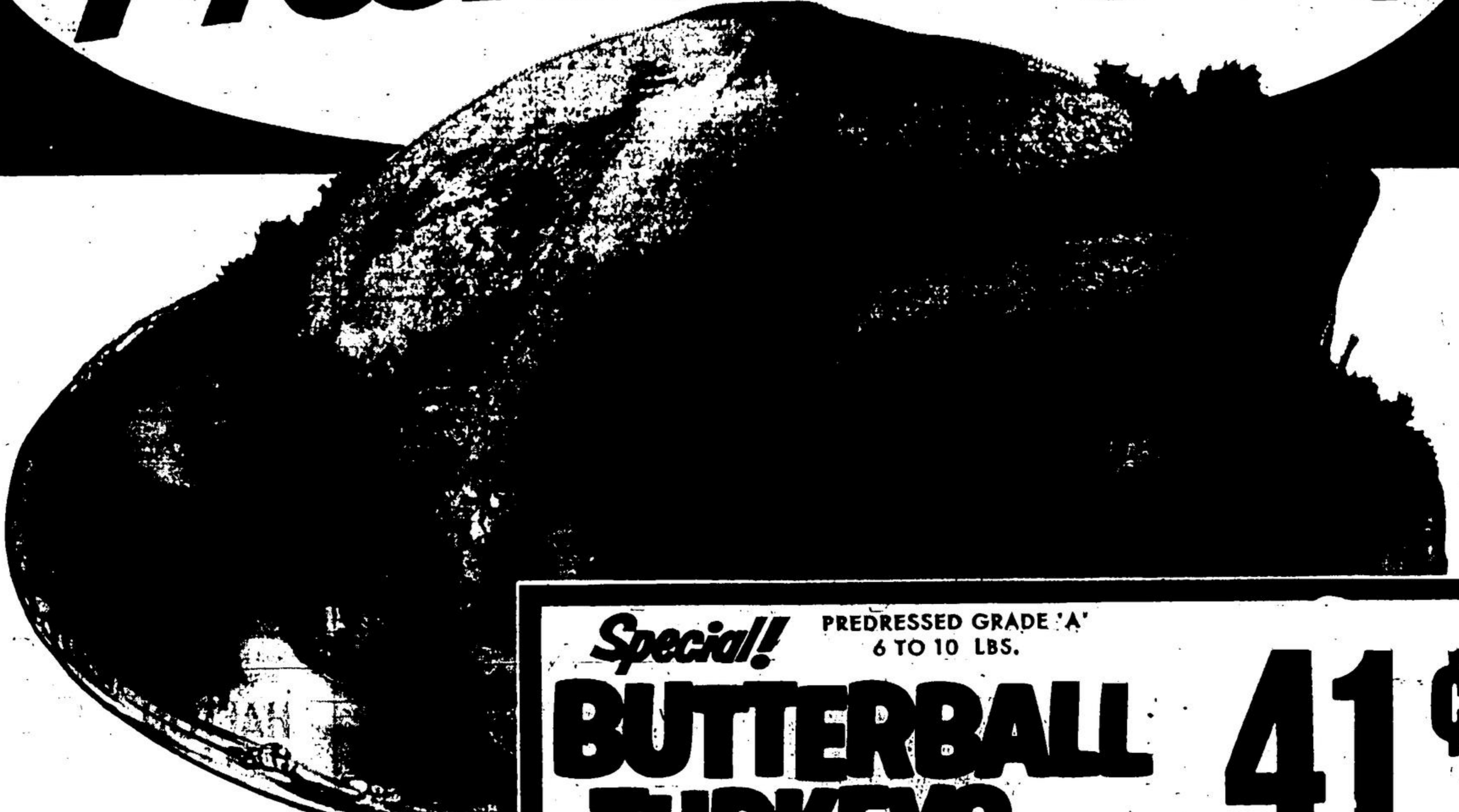
Paul Wagstaffe and Cecil Barth attended the Farm and Industrial Equipment Trade Show in the Coliseum, Toronto, last Thursday.
