Mr. McNairn, who is a gradtern Ontario universities, spent two years in Africa - first as an African Crossroader in 1962, and as a teacher in an African University in 1983 and 1984. He is presently articling in law in Toronto and lives at

his home in Waterdown.

His address was illustrated by many lovely views of the East African countryside of Zanzibar. He told of some of the work done by the Crossroaders as they work along with the Africans in building and educating. He said that contrary to the news coming out of the Congo these days, most Africans are friendly and eager to learn. The Congo accounts for only one eighth of the African

population. As an aside he showed pictures of the celebrations in Kenya when the 'new Kenya flag' went up without any parliamentary debate.
