Sought Seat in Parliament For Peel Liberals in 1926

Herbert J. W. Taylor, a resident of Cheltenham since 1926, died on Sunday, January 24, in the Georgetown and District Memorial Hospital after a lengthy illness. He was born March 15, 1882 on lot 24, third line west, Chinguacousy, the son of James Peter Taylor and Esther Walker. He was predeceased by his brother, Thomas Taylor of Toronto, and his sisters, Mrs. Herbert Bessey, and Mrs. Walter T. Evans of Georgetown, and Mrs. Victor Yrizar of Cheltenham.

Mr. Taylor maintained a wide variety of vital interests throughout his long lifetime. His church occupied always a focal point in his interests. He was a member and elder of the Union Presbyterian church until he moved to Cheltenham in 1926 where he joined the United Church. Here he served not only as elder but also as Sunday School superintendent for seventeen years.

Expect Results Police Probe Next Week

The investigation into the case called for by council has been completed and the Ontario Police Commission will be made known within the next few days.

Magistrate R. Graham of the Police Commission said yesterday a report on the affairs of the Georgetown Police Department will be issued early next week.

The investigation was called for in mid-December and got underway January 19.

All nine Georgetown council members voted for the investigation in a recorded vote at a council meeting December 14. Councillors had expressed concern over the number of resignations from the Police Department, failure of one newly hired man to stay a week with the force and of another to show up after being hired. It was also charged that a junior officer was left in charge of the town and his request for aid from senior officers refused.

Objects to Cruiser, Men Being Taken Out of Town

Milton Councillor Charles Meney will head the North Halton Urban Board as chair-man for 1963. He was chosen Wednesday evening of last week during the inaugural meeting in Georgetown.

Mayor Joe Gibbons of Georgetown sparked the main topic for the evening when he proposed for individual police court sessions in Acton, Georgetown and Milton rather than the present system of one court session in Milton for all three municipalities.

Mr. Gibbons objected strongly to having the Georgetown police force short-handed during court in Milton as well as a police cruiser out of town during this time.

Mr. Gibbons said he had notified Magistrate Kenneth Landon regarding his objection and representatives from Acton and Milton will also set their respective councils to do the same.

Acton clerk Jack McGeachie was named secretary for the board for the 1963 term.
