**Union District Farmer Owned Racing Stable**

A Union district farmer all his life, and a prominent member of Union Presbyterian Church, George Herbert Leslie, 62 died in Guelph General Hospital on January 31.

Son of Robert F. Leslie and Matilda Lyons, he was born on the family homestead, lot 20, 5th Line West, Chinguacousy. The land had been taken from the crown by his grandfather in 1821. Mr. Leslie's son Hugh now operates the farm.

He attended school in a building now used as a community hall at the corner of Lot 22 and 5th Line. As a member of Union Presbyterian Church, he had served as an elder for many years. He was particularly interested in the church's mission work, and many of his relatives and friends completed donations to his memory.

He owned a stable of horses which raced at tracks in Ontario. Mr. Leslie married Mabel Dolson in March, 1913, in a ceremony which took place in Mount Pleasant Presbyterian Church. Besides his wife, he leaves a family of six, Mrs. George Chapman (Margaret) of Sudbury, Mrs. Paul (Helen) of Montreal, Mrs. Mervyn Samuels (Ethel) of Toronto, Eric, Hugh and Robert, all of R.R. 4 Georgetown; ten grandchildren; and two brothers, Thomas L. Leslie, Sedgewick, Alberta and Stewart Leslie, Georgetown. He was predeceased by sisters Mrs. William Lyons, Mrs. Edward Catton, Mrs. Albert Dolson, and Mrs. Sarah in infancy. Rev. Herbert Dumanson conducted the funeral service February 3rd in Union Church. Pallbearers were Kenneth Cameron, Leslie Catton, G. Bishop, Howard and Don Dolson, and a cousin, Tom Leslie. Interment was in Greenwood Cemetery, Georgetown.

**East End Complains, so Study Chlorine Content**

Town residents and the Ontario Water Resources Commission seem to disagree on the chlorine content of the water. The OWRC says it is satisfactory, and the citizens say, "you can't make a decent cup of coffee or tea in the east end" - or so Reeve J. Elliott told Council Monday night.

Water Chairman Don Powers claimed that the readings were either right on or very close to the required 25 parts per million of chlorine.

While the Water Resources Commission report found the chlorine content satisfactory, they felt the method of feeding in the calgon should be reconsidered. They also regretted that the elevated storage tank they had recommended had not been installed.

Councillor Roy Ballentine suggested that tests be taken in the east end, right at the taps, in various locations, to find if the chlorine content was higher in one area than another.

This suggestion will be followed.
