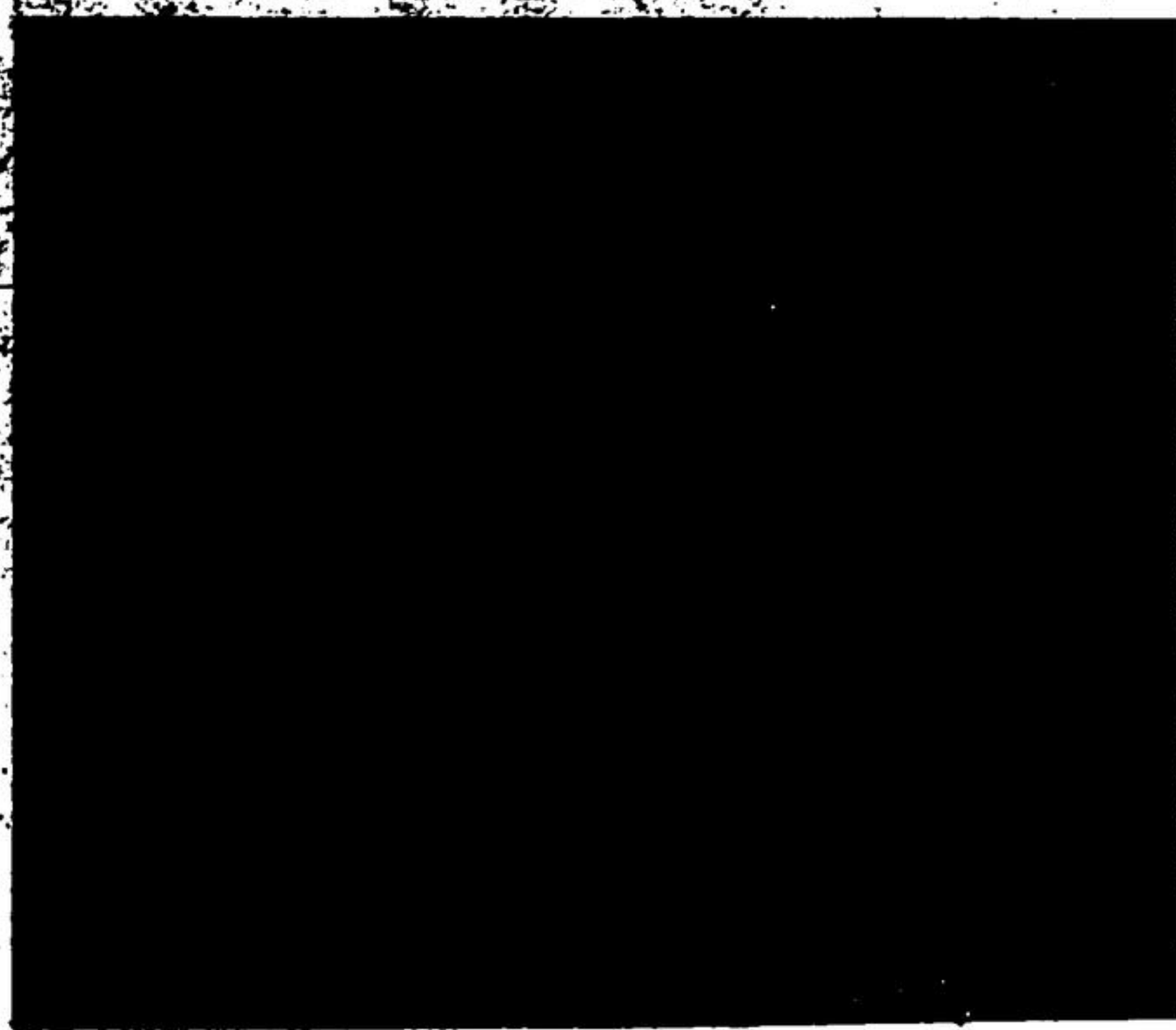


# In Glen Williams It's a Week of Surveying the Damage, Mopping Up and Wondering What's Next



TOP LEFT: Two battered cars much the worse for wear after ice cakes rammed them Friday.

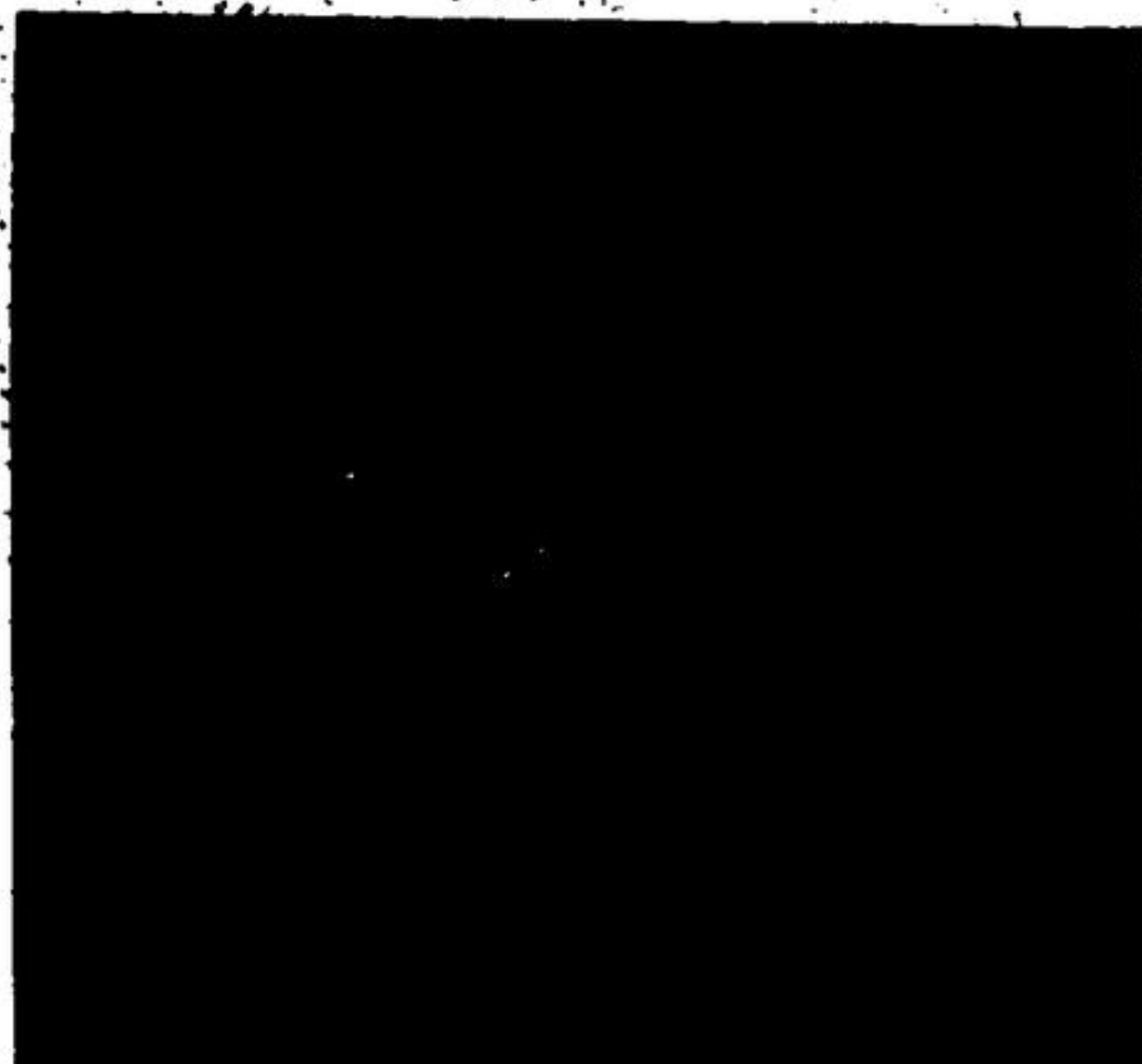
BOTTOM LEFT: A row of fence posts indicates where the 9th Line lies submerged under the flood waters.

The news came out of a meeting of Region 4 delegates Feb. 1. Region 4 encompasses this area (North Halton, Oakville and Hamilton).

Executive members learned at the meeting that the Ontario Association for Retarded Children is setting up a memorial fund for the late Mr. McQuarrie, a former president of the association. It was also noted the Sunshine School, R.R. 2 Georgetown, might also benefit from the new fund.

Executive members were pleased to learn that a carpenter, Mr. Van Oosten of Oakville, has agreed to spend two hours each week at the Sunshine School and show the youngsters how to use a hammer and saw. Already some of the youngsters have built bird cages and Mr. Van Oosten has constructed a work bench.

It was also learned that artist William Roberts of the Ontario Art College will bring two, fourth year art students to Sunshine School to show the students how to enamel brooches and do other art projects.

In other business conducted at the meeting members:

• Were told that youngsters prepare hot lunches twice a month.

• Heard that the Georgetown Citizens Band had turned

over the proceeds of their Christmas concert to the Association, to be used for school projects.

• Received a snow shovel and vacuum cleaner from the Acton Ladies' Auxiliary of the Association. Money for the two articles had been raised by keeping cash register tapes. The vacuum cleaner will be used to show the youngsters how to operate the machine and also how to clean and dust.

• Learned that storage is a great problem at the school. Members are presently searching for an old garage or utility shed that might be erected on the school property and be used as a storage shed.
