

Compulsory Blood Tests Advocated by Attorney

Halt County Crown Attorney Peter McWilliams recommended in a report of statistics pertaining to fatal accidents in Halt County that blood alcohol tests should be compulsory for all drivers involved in fatal motor vehicle accidents.

Mr. McWilliams, appalled by the daily automobile accident rate, made an accident survey covering occurrences from 1961 (inclusive) until the end of 1964.

of 18 or 23.3 per cent died in 1963.

"It is my submission that blood alcohol tests should be compulsory for all drivers involved in fatal motor vehicle accidents if for no other reason than to obtain complete statistical information," wrote Mr. McWilliams in a postscript to his survey.

According to the survey despite a general and continuing increase of both fatal motor vehicle accidents and fatalities a downward trend persisted in Halt County last year.

In his report Mr. McWilliams stated, "I attribute the reduction to vigorous police work prosecution and adequate penalties imposed by the courts."

The survey reveals that the number of collisions with other vehicles dropped to one half of 1962 and 1963 numbers last year.

"This is part due to the designation of almost all rural intersections as 'stop thru' intersections," Mr. McWilliams explained.

He stated that the greatest drop was apparent in rear-end collisions from four in 1962 to one in 1963. "I am pleased," he said, "to report that the number of child pedestrians killed dropped from two in 1962 to one in 1963.

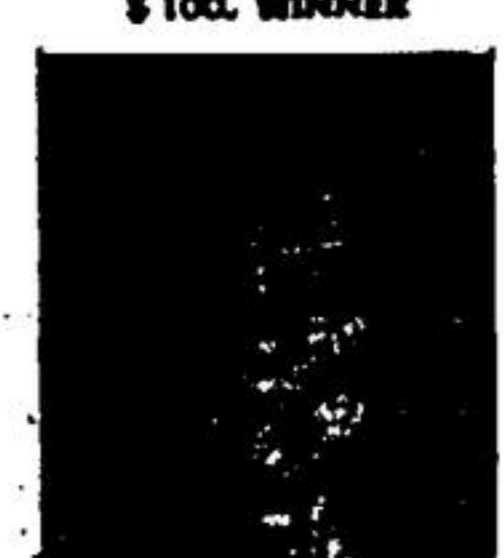

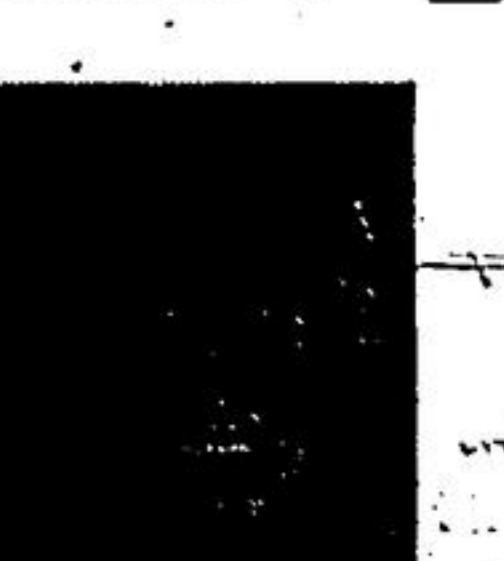
