

Study Sketch Plans for Addition to High School

The Georgetown high school building committee will meet with a Barnett and Reid architect this week to review sketch plans for the proposed addition to the school. The plans were disclosed at a regular meeting of the board Monday night.

The building committee, a body formed at the inaugural meeting to handle the business of the addition's construction is headed by board chairman Bill Carr.

President Inspector F. W. Wrenn is making an annual report to the trustees he noted definite improvement in the affairs of the school.

Master Feed mill manager Stuart Hall of Stewarttown was appointed to the Advisory Vocational Commission filling a vacancy created when Ted Gorth joined board. The Advisory Vocational Commission helps administer the technical training end of the school.

The resignation of Mrs. Wrenn's Cuddy was accepted at Monday's meeting. Mrs. Cuddy, a member of the Commercial teaching staff, will leave at the end of the present term.

The GDHS board will be a group of trustees from other boards who will interview new teachers during all day interview session in the Park Plaza Hotel Feb. 27.

The exact number of additional and replacement staff is not yet known, but at least three and possibly as many as ten depending on resignations between now and deadline.

Three From Here Take EMO Course for Police

A classroom filled with auxiliary police recruits, three of them from Georgetown, sat at their desks for the first session of a twelve week police training course Wednesday night in Burlington Central School.

The recruits received a course outline at the first class which consists of instructions on Criminal Code law, powers of arrest, powers of search (with or without warrant), crowd control, highway traffic act, traffic control patrol techniques and report writing.

The men were briefed by Burlington Chief Kenneth Skerrette, director of police services, and Bruce Macgregor, Emergency Measures Organization co-ordinator.

Upon graduating from the course the auxiliary policemen will perform their duties in the respective Halton County municipalities in which they live.

Attending from Georgetown were Clarence Francis, 35 Shelley St., Jim James, 328 John St. and David Bell, 41 Delrex Blvd.

Globe Carrier Boys Plagued by Thefts
