

Carter, Ferguson Lead GDHS Wrestlers to Win

Georgetown District High School wrestlers covered themselves with glory Saturday when they took 2nd place in a major wrestling tournament at the Central Peel Composite School, Brampton.

Competing schools in their fourth year of active competition were Kipling and Royal York of Etobicoke, New Toronto, Central Peel and Arthur.

For the local wrestling team, organized after the Christmas holidays it was just their second taste of competition. Georgetown's second place finish was the talk of the meet.

In tournament scoring, points are awarded for four places, 10, 7, 4, 3 respectively plus 1 point for a win and 1 point for pinning an opponent.

When it was all over, Kipling had 122, Georgetown 78, Central Peel 73, Royal York 35, Arthur 35, New Toronto 28.

Georgetown high had entries in 11 of the 13 classes, and 10 of these placed in the top four.

The Claderella story of the tournament belongs to Georgetown's 98 pounder Dave Carter. At weigh-in time, Carter was 145 pounds overweight. After three-quarters of an hour of running and calisthenics, weighted down with 8 football sweaters he made the 98 pound limit. He then took his first pinfall at all day and proceeded to pin three opponents to win the championship.

Brian Youmans, a fine young GDHS wrestler, was the only member who failed to place. He ran into one of the strongest weight classes. Several of the other Georgetown team members missed being class champions by narrow margins.
