Georgetown names dot the Tri-County Minor Hockey bulletin listing the year's top scorers, most valuable players and best goalies just released this week. Five levels, Novice, Pee-wee, Bantams, Midget and Juvenile, operate in the Tri-County setup.

Georgetown Novice Fin Arnold was runner up in the points race with 11 goals and 11 assists for 22 points, and was also given the runner-up spot in the ballot for the Most Valuable Player. He received 6 votes to the winner's 7.

Neil Kortzak was second in the points standing in Pee-wee. He scored 20 goals and collected 18 assists for 38 points. He was also runner up for Most Valuable Player honours in the Pee-wee league with 7 votes.

No Georgetown players made the charmed circle in Bantam competition, but in Midget the top two players were both Georgetowners - Bill Dwyer with 31 goals and 25 assists for 56 points, and Paul Robinson with 35 goals and 17 assists for 52 points. Dwyer also won the MVP honours with 10 votes.

Georgetown Juveniles' Keith Bennett made it to 4th place in the Juvenile scoring with 11 goals and 3 assists for 14 points.

Two Georgetown minor goalies were winners and one was a runner-up in comparisons of the goals-against average. John Blair of Georgetown Pee-wees was best in that league with a 1.83 average; and Brian Peavoy was the best Midget goalie in Tri-County with a 1.90 average. Local Novices' Ray Peacock had a 1.43 average good enough for the runner-up spot among Novice netminders.

## Two Games Ten Goals Selby Poison To Hanover

Doug Selby, Georgetown Beavers' cool headed left-winger exploded for ten goals in two games last week, 6 of them against Hanover here Sunday, tying a record set by Theo Charlton in 1957. Charlton scored six against Preston as a Georgetown Junior C centre, and, like Selby, made it 10 in two games with 4 goals next time out in a game in Elmira.

Selby scored 4 times Tuesday, Feb. 6th in Hanover as Georgetown snatched an easy 7-1 win Sunday, the Beavers stomped him over the tail-enders 12-1.

Selby also picked up two assists in the two Hanover games to vault into a first place tie with Bill Campbell in the points race. Campbell, however, still has an edge in goals scored - 23 to 21.

The pair of wins gave Georgetown a 15-18-1 record for 31 points, good enough for 4th place in the O.H.A. Central Ontario loop. But it will take some battling to hold that position. Preston has the same point total, Dundas and Milton, have moved to within 3 points, and Orangeville is just 4 points off Beavers' heels.

Beavers' three remaining games are in Oranville tonight (Thursday), Milton is here Sunday afternoon, and in Milton on Friday, Feb. 26th.

Selby, who was a centre until coach Del Beaumont switched him to the left side a couple of games back, accounted for all the first period scoring on Sunday, scoring 4 times in a row. Bill Campbell and Hay assisted on the first one at 1:24, Campbell and Riddall on the second at 2:30; Hay and Riddall on the third at 12:51; and Campbell and Riddall on the fourth at 16:45.

The only Hanover goal came at 7:01 of the middle period, Cochrane the marksmen was helped by Boison. Hepton made it 5-1 from Murray Marchmont at 16:48, and Selby snapped his 22 minute slump to score Georgetown's 6th counter from Campbell and Marchmont at 18:37.

Beavers went to work on the points totals in the second third. Sheppard from Haines and Malcolm; Terry Lane from Riddall and Selby; Selby from Hay and Riddall; Hay from Campbell and Cooper; and finally Sheppard from Hepton.
