

Separatism, Social Security In Model Parliament Debate

Stewart Saxe of Georgetown High School will be Leader of the Opposition and John Paul of Oakville Trafalgar High School will be acting Prime Minister at the Model Parliament in Georgetown and District High School, Saturday.

Students from participating high schools in Halton, Peel and the Province of Quebec have elected representatives to the parliament and defeated Liberal leadership candidate Charles Yesselman has been designated Governor General and will read the speech from the throne.

Mr. Yesselman will also be guest speaker at a luncheon.

The two parties sitting in the House will be the National party as the Government and the Dominion party as the opposition.

Platform planks of the Dominion party call for placing all transportation and communications in the hands of private enterprise. It also calls for necessary government action — including force of arms — to prevent political separation in Canada.

The National Party is calling for social security, medical, disability pensions, and free university education through federal grants to the provinces. They favour the formation of a national economic planning council to place more power and new industries in depressed regions, and to control the fluctuation of raw materials.
