Council Seeks Solution For Rusty Water, Sewer Back-ups

The problem of iron rust in Georgetown's water supply, and sewage backs up into residence cellars, is bothering town council.

T. R. Maslin, 144 Prince Charles Drive in a letter read at Monday's council meeting urged storm sewers on his street. And Reeve Elliott said similar sewer trouble has occurred in other locations, including Hewson Crescent.

Cr. Mas Young opined that proper cleaning of sewers couldn't be done because of lack of manpower. Later in the meeting, a request was received from town foreman Alf Collins to boost the outside staff from 14 to present 18 men.

The discussion strayed off course when Mayor Gibbons and Cr. Powers argued about whether debentures had been issued in previous years for storm sewer installation.

A former mayor had appeared at council recently to criticize debenturing the Cedarvale school purchase, said Mayor Gibbons, yet there had been debentures in 1960 and 1961 and 1963. "and a rise in mill rate as well."

"Last year the mill rate stayed the same and we issued no debentures" he added.

Cr. Powers claimed the debentures were not for the storm sewers but for a sewage lift station.

"I don't recall any storm sewer debentures," said Deputy Reeve Hunter.

"How about the famous champagne pump?" said the mayor. "\$7,583 came from capital account which should never have been used for that."
