

Details Centennial Plans To Harrison School Group

Georgetown's plans for the 1997 centennial year were detailed by Councillor Bill Smith when he talked to Harrison Teacher-Parent Association recently.

After mentioning a few projects in other centres - the most unusual a crematorium for a far northern town, he described the Cedarvale school property which will be Georgetown's lasting memorial to Canada's 100th birthday.

With conservation and aerial maps, he showed the central location of the property. For

\$80,000, the town will receive twenty acres with two houses and the former school structure which has classrooms, kitchen, bedrooms, gym and office. Net cost to the town will be \$30,000 after government grants, and the town is eligible for a \$800 yearly maintenance grant.

His opinion is that until payments are completed, no major plans should be made for improvements to the property. The main thing is that the town has a choice recreation area, centrally located, for the benefit of future generations.

Financing is planned by a \$50,000 debenture issue. Mr. Smith told his audience that he is firmly convinced the purchase will not raise taxes.

As possible uses, he said the building is suited for horticultural meetings, Barbershopper rehearsals, offices for scouts and guides, senior citizens meetings, Little Theatre rehearsals, service club dinners, square dancing, and as a dormitory for visiting hockey players.

The property lends itself to picnics, tobogganing and skiing, play areas, skating rinks and wading pools and a band shell.

Peter Hedgecock conducted the meeting. He informed parents that the association is considering adopting an orphan

through the Save the Children fund or Christian Children's fund. A child can be adopted for \$10 a month from a chosen country and correspondence exchanged.

He announced the date for the annual Fun Fair as May 8th.

Ceremony Raises New Flag on Halton County Bldg.

Canada's new flag flutters proudly atop the flagpole at the Halton County Administration Building, raised Tuesday afternoon, Feb. 16, prior to the February meeting of Halton County Council.

In a brief ceremony, Rev. John Schriell, of St. David's Presbyterian Church, Campbellville, spoke of his adopted country - Canada - and of its youth and aggressiveness.

Following the reading of the official proclamation by Warden Herb Merry, the assemblage stood at attention as the Red Ensign was lowered for the last time as a national flag, by Reeve H. Hinton of Acton.

Then solemnly Warden Merry raised the new red maple leaf flag to the top of the pole.

After a short invocation by Rev. Schriell, the crowd dispersed leaving Canada's flag waving in the strong breeze.
