## Motorist Cuts Hand When Cars Collide

A Limehouse motorist had his hand cut with broken glass in one of several motor vehicle accidents in town during the past week. George Scholtz, R.R. 1, Limehouse, was taken to hospital by Georgetown Police Constable Dan Martin following the collision.

Scholtz was leaving Georgetown downtown parking lot in a 1965 Volkswagen when struck by a 1957 Plymouth travelling west on Mack St. operated by Kenneth W. Chapel of Acton.

The small car took \$800 in damage and the Plymouth \$300.

Cars driven by Chester Melanson, R.R. 3 Georgetown, and Maetje Bergans, 57 Charles St., collided head-on at the Guelph St. - John St. intersection the same day resulting in \$550 damage. Melanson was making a right turn onto Guelph St. and Bergans was southbound on Guelph St. at the time of the accident.

Friday night saw a minor collision at the intersection of Guelph and Mountainview. A 1960 Rambler, driven by Len Saschenbrecker, 36 Church St. and a 1959 Ford sedan driven by Gladys Scratch, 35, Albert St. were both eastbound on

the highway when they hit. The Scratch car was starting to make a left turn onto Mountainview as the Saschenbrecker car attempted to pass. Damage here was \$50 to the Rambler and \$50 to the Ford.

Brampton and Acton men were drivers of cars in a collision opposite the Delrex plaza Saturday morning. Police said Frank W. Maricak, Acton, and Donald Ray Samis, Brampton, were both westbound on Guelph St. Maricak was passing when Samis started to turn into the plaza entrance. Both vehicles received approximately \$150 damage.

A parked car was damaged

when a front end loader

backed into it Wednesday morning, March 3. The loader was being operated by Vittorio Sec-

co on Maple Ave. opposite Holy Cross Church when the brakes failed. It rolled back into a 1965 Volkswagen owned by Onello Perrone, of Toronto.
