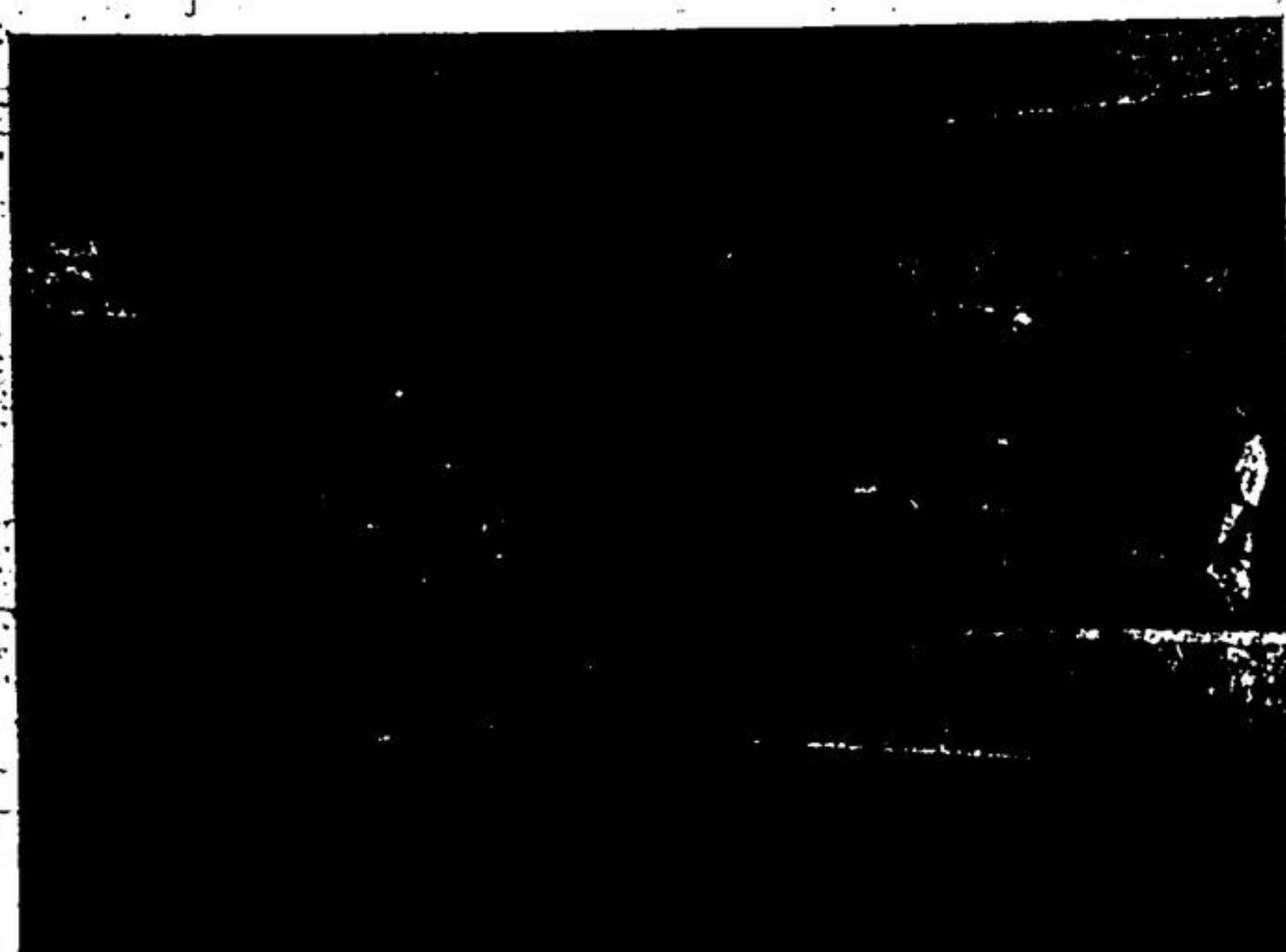


# BROWNIES, GUIDE COMPANIES COMBINE FOR VARIETY SHOW
