Halton County Fire Prevention Bureau received a special recognition for its outstanding fire prevention work during the 1954-55 season.

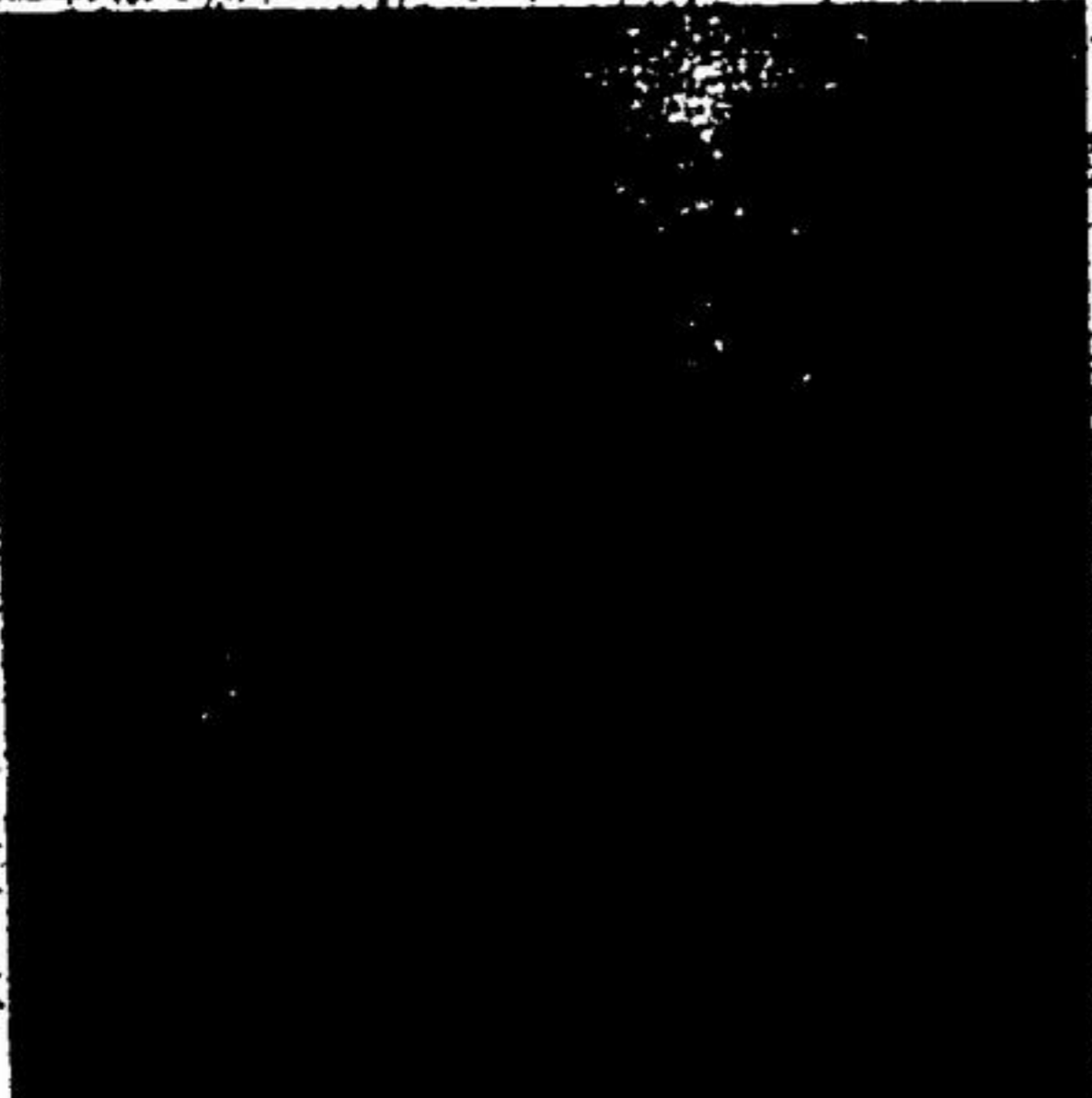
